IMPROVEMENT SEEN IN SEED GRAIN SURVEY

The results of Halton County Seed Drill Survey are based on a a total of 31 samples (28 cereals and 3 small seeds.) 65 per cent of all samples graded No.- 1, 10 per cent No. 2, 10 per cent No. 3 and 25 per cent were blassified as re-

jects. Sixty eight per cent of samples were cleaned by farm fanning mills and 23 per cent by seed cleaning plants with the remainder being uncleaned. 52 per cent of the farm cleaned samples graded No. 1, 10 per cent No. 2, 14 per cent No. 3, and 24 per cent were rejected. In comparison 71 per cent of samples cleaned in seed cleaning plants graded No. 1; none were classified as No. 2 or No. 3; 29 per cent were rejected. Seed disinfectants were applied to 68 per cent of all cereal samples. These results compare reasonably well with the group avcrages.

Sow Thistle, Dock, Couch, Bladder, Campion and Mustard. Some secandary noxious weed seeds found were Wild Carrot, Wild Oets, Ragweed and Nightflowering Catchfly. In small seeds, the smaple grading No. 1 contained 1 Bladder Campion, 5 Ribgrass and 2 Daisy, however, this is not a good example of No. 1 Seed? The other two samples contained a comparatively larger quantity of weed seeds with the Rejected sample containing 146 weed seeds per ounce. This is not as bad as some other samples which were taken in other areas but does show that far too many weed seeds are getting into the seed being used in the county.

While we still have a long way to go in improving the quality of jour seed grain, it is encouraging to note a considerable improvement over the survey made a year ago, when only 32 per cent graded No.
