**NINETY X-RAY CANVASSERS
WILL VISIT EVERY HOME**

Ninety men and women from the Women's Institute, the IOOE, the Women's Auxiliary of the Legion, Rebekahs, Lions Club, Masons, Oddfellows, the Unions and the Legion have volunteered to visit every home in Georgetown to tell them of the meaning of the free chest x-ray and its place in health protection.

On Monday, December 1st these canvassers will start and finish by December 12th. There has been a wonderful cooperative effort in connection with this event so far. This is the first year that so complete a survey has been attempted and a 100 per cent coverage is hoped for. In the x-ray effort of 1947-48 only 41 per cent coverage was reached. That is not good enough. There are twenty three cases of tuberculosis from Halton in sanatoria now. This might have been avoided if these people had been checked in time. There are also 75 who have undergone hospitalization and are under observation.

The object of the canvass is of course to acquaint people with the free x-ray clinics being conducted in Halton County by the Ontario Department of Health. The entire county will be covered starting at Palestino on December 1 and finishing at Acton on December 19. The canvassing of the county districts is being done by the Women's Institutes of which there are 24 operating in the county. Employees of the two paper mills will be x-rayed by a mobile unit stationed between the two mills. Smith & Stone employees, since they are x-rayed in their own usual

manner, will not be called on to go to the clinic. The High School pupils will go in a body with their teachers to be x-rayed.

Only those over 12 years of age are x-rayed.

The sale of Christmas seals is being conducted throughout the county at the present time and it is from the proceeds of this sale that this effort is financed. Twelve thousand letters with the seals are being mailed this week and it is hoped that the response will be even greater than it was last year when Georgetown and district was credited with contributing \$618.00.

This survey is a real community affair and every one should remember to do two things within the next two or three weeks.

1. Send in your contribution after receipt of your letter or contribute through the Canadian Bank of Commerce.

2. Visit the clinic on December 16 or 17 and have the x-ray.

**Sixteen Councils Ask
Meat Packing Probe**

Sixteen counties in Ontario have endorsed a resolution passed last month by Peel County council calling for a government investigation into the meat packing industry.

The resolution, which will be forwarded to federal agricultural minister Gardiner asks that the floor price for livestock offered to packers be increased to meet current wage levels in labour.

County councils which have endorsed the resolution include, Halton, York, Waterloo, Wellington, Wentworth, Norfolk, Brant and Oxford.

At present farmers claim that they cannot maintain a satisfactory rate of profit, with present cost of feed and labor; unless they receive more money for livestock. Pig breeders have been particularly hard hit since a shortage of pork two years ago with a consequently inflated price increased production in Canada to the point where the present price is much too low.

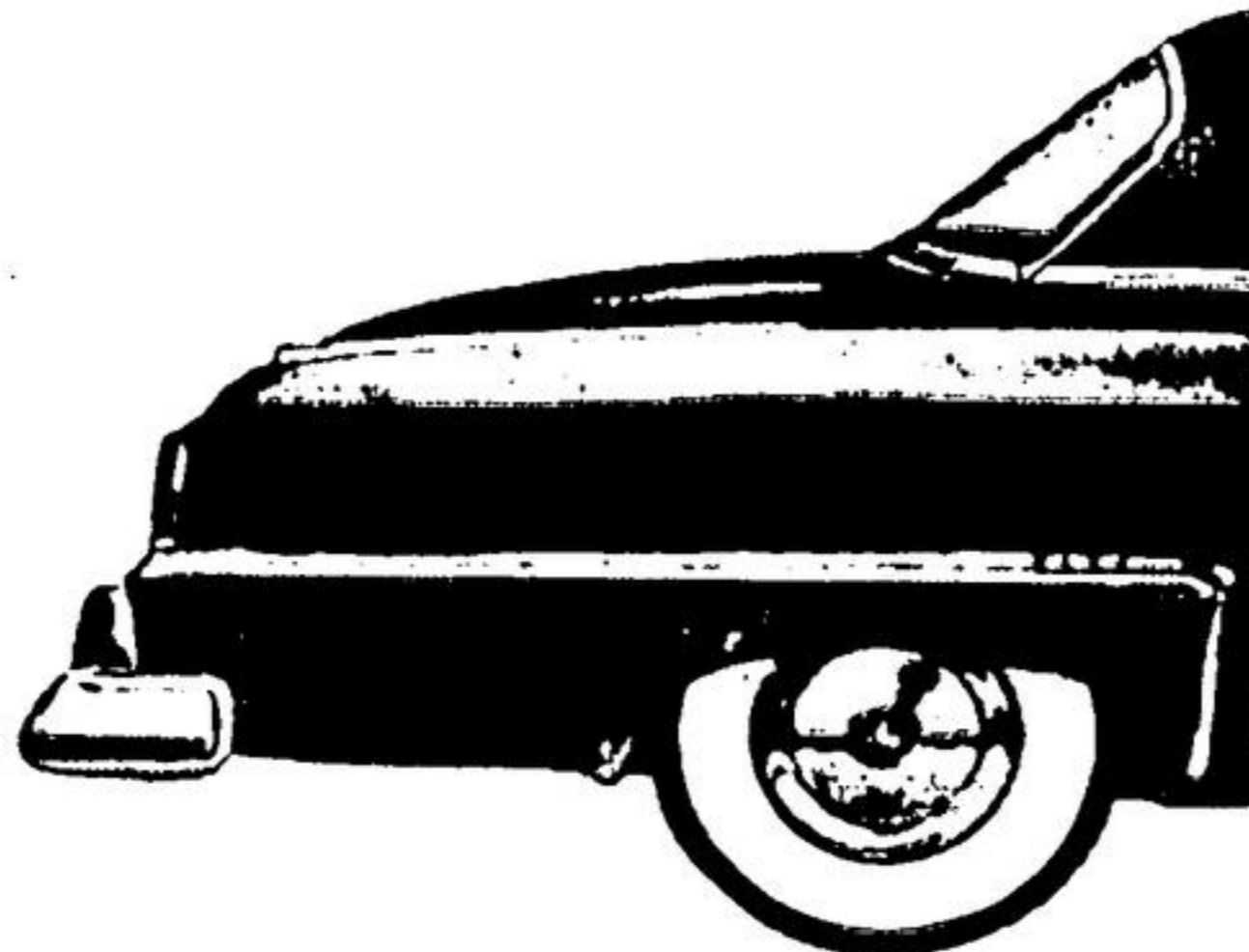

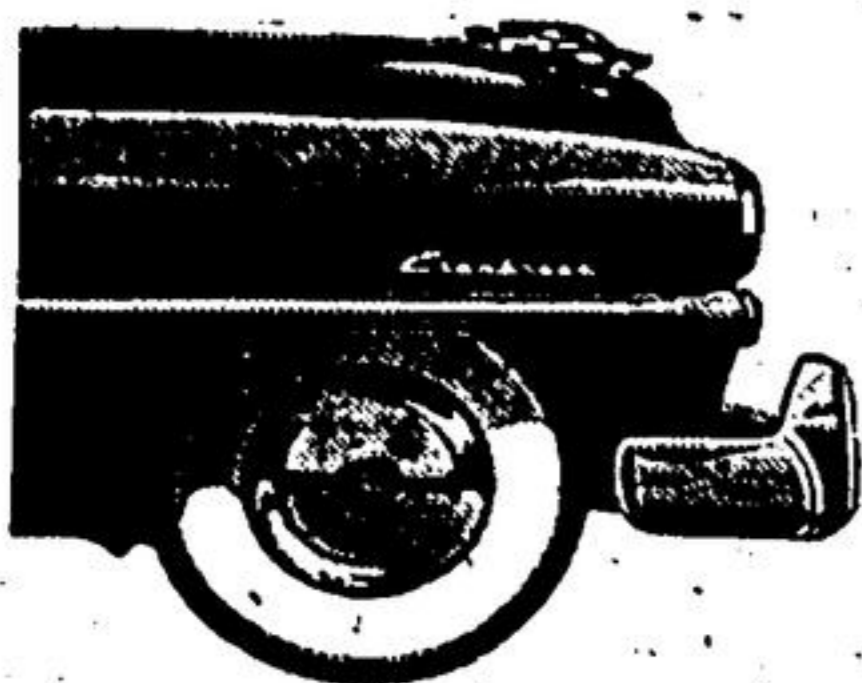
