Sixteen counties in Ontario have endorsed a resolution passed last month by Peel County council calling for a government investigation into the meet packing industry.

The resolution, which will be forwarded to federal agricultural minister Gardiner asks that the floor price for livestock offered to packers be increased to meet current wage levels in labour.


County councils which have endorsed the resolution include, Halton, York, Waterloo, Wellington, Wentworth, Norfolk, Brant and Ox-

At present farmers claim that they cannot maintain a satisfactory rate of profit, with present cost of feed and labor; unless they receive more money for livestock. Pig breeders have been particularly hard hit since a shortage of pork two years ago with a consequently inflated price increased production in Canada to the point where the present price is much too low.


