AT ESQUESING COUNCIL ON MONDAY, DECEMBER 18

The \$350,000 building program for North Halton high schools was ratified, on the understanding that costs among the five municipalities involved will be shared on the equalized assessment basis.

Arthur Beaumont and George C. Brown were appointed members of the high school district board for 1933.

Reeve Leslie was authorized to sign agreements with Milton and Acton establishing fire districts for portions of the township in these districts. A by-law was passed establishing a fire area in Georgetown district also. Acton and Georgetown will receive \$50 per fire call until such time as area equipment is purchased.

Fox claims of \$5 each under the county by-law totalled \$270 and were paid to: Wm. Sheppard, Acton, \$100; John Chisholm, Acton, \$25; Fred Switzer, Norval and Alf Bridgen, Hornby, \$15 each; Peter Fendley, Norval, S. A. Morris, of Georgetown, H. Beers, Georgetown, Edward Elliott, Acton, \$10 each; \$5 each to E. J. Costigan, Jim Presswood, John Ruddell, Ralph Bludd, A. N. Stark, William Pearson, Floyd Valey, Georgetown; Frank Jones, E. B. Mainprize, Acton; Harry Wilson, Grant Stark, Milton; William Bennett, Thomas Hill, Glen Williams, Edward Robertson, Hornby; John Verlis, Norval.

A \$250 payment was made to Milton for firemen attending five fires in Esquesing during the year. These were at Sam Muddle's, J. Irving's, D. McCallum's, G. Fisher's and a stump fire at Hornby.

Sheep claims totalled \$422, paid to Emmett McGibbon, 3 Reg. ewe lambs, \$118 and John Coulson, 2 Reg. yearling ewes, 2 Reg. ewe lambs, 2 market lambs, Reg. ewe, 4 ewes and flock damage, \$322. At an earlier meeting in November, \$100 was paid to Meldrum Stark for

flock damage and a Reg. Southdown ewe, awarded by Alfred Ayer, arbitrator.

Thanks was extended to J. Dillon and zone forester C. R. Groves for help in connection with the bush fire at Terra Cotta.

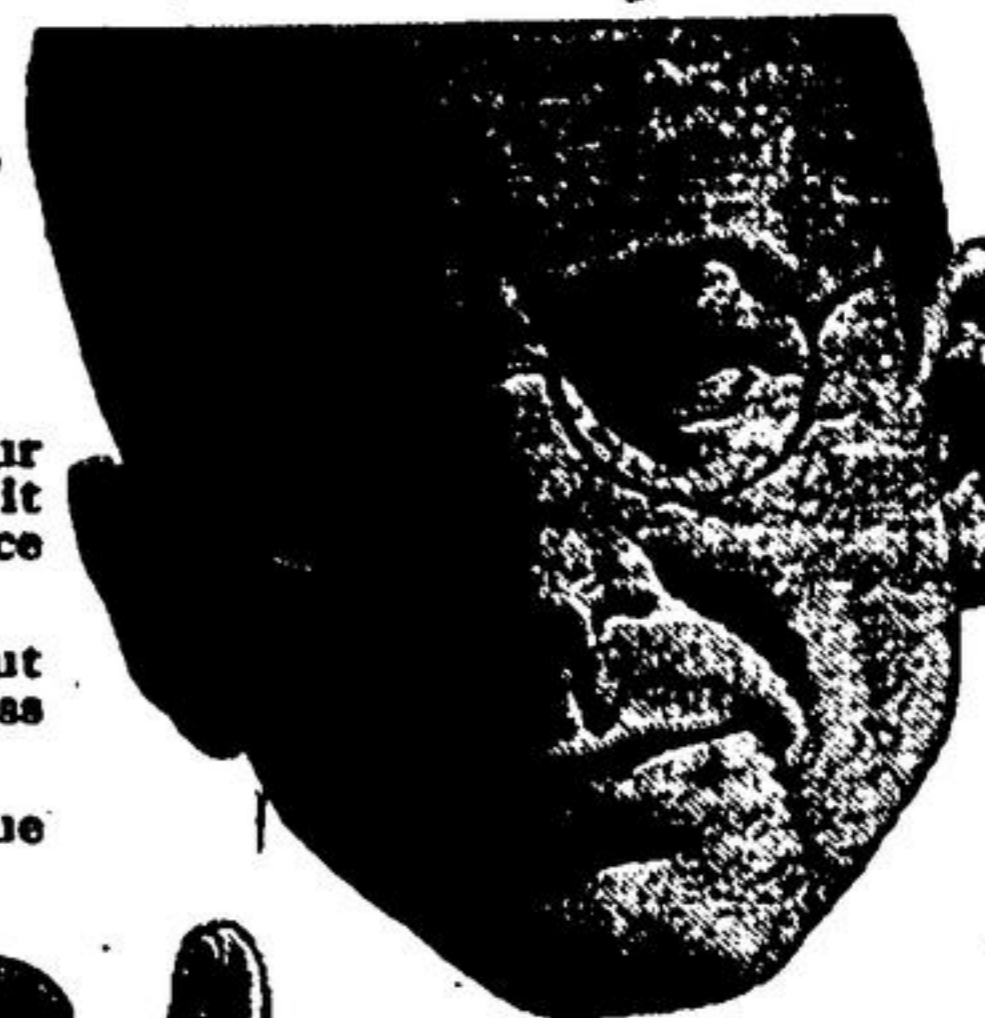
