**Communion Sunday At St. John's Church**

Sunday morning service at St. John's United Church was a Communion service, a very appropriate way for a professing Christian to use the first service of the new year.

Rev. John M. Smith noted that we had just passed our celebration of Christ's birth, and also the passing of the old year into the new; had made new resolutions as to our behaviour, and now it was fitting as we accepted the Lord's invitation to come to His table, to do as Paul exhorted the Christians of his day to do, that is, examine ourselves and make sure that our character and motives are in line with the Jesus way of life, so that we come not to His table unworthily.

The communion should bring us face to face with the cross, not forgetting the teachings of Jesus and His living example, but seeing in the Cross their culmination in showing how great was God's love and sacrifice for His world. Then, too, if we take the communion seriously and earnestly, it should bring us to true repentance and penitence as expressed in Mr. Smith's scripture lesson by Isaiah: "I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lifted up—and cried out, woe is me for I am undone." And as Isaiah was made aware of his forgiveness following his earnest repentance, "thine iniquity is taken away and thy sin purged", so should the communion make us aware of our forgiveness, and make us ready to say like Isaiah, "Here am I, send me."

The beginning of a new year and its first communion should also bring a re-dedication of ourselves to His service and an earnest intercession before God for our nation and the world of nations. And let us remember that corporate com-
