An active year in all departments of Norval United Church was reported at the annual meeting of the church congregation held Friday afternoon.

Rev. C. C. Gilbert presided at the meeting which was preceded by dinner served by the church ladies. There was some discussion about appointing a choir leader for the church which at present does not have such an official.

The Sunday School receipts were \$206, Young People's Association \$48, Mission Band \$60 and Baby Band \$5.

Brown, A. E. Carney, Earl Hyatt, William South and Mr. Laidlaw. Other members of the board include Lorne Cleave, W. Hyatt, H. Laidlaw, J. H. Cameron, J. Brownridge and G. Laidlaw.

Elaine Laird and Ruth Wilson will be organists this year. The church board of trustees is composed of Lorne Cleave, William Graham, George Brown, J. Laidlaw, N. T. Laidlaw, J. Cascadden, and Lt.-Col. A. E. Noble.

Mr. Gilbert is chairman of the session and H. G. Lyons clerk, with members Col. Noble, W. P. Laidlaw, J. Laidlaw, E. Hyatt, M. Guy Wilson, N. T. Laidlaw, and Lorne Cleave.
