Dr. Charles Best Presented With **Achievement Medal**

Dr. Charles Herbert Best, co-discoverer of insulin and one of the world's great medical scientists, was presented with the Alpha Omega Achievement Medal during the dental fraternity's 45th annual convention dinner.

"I feel greatly honored," said Dr. Best, as he received the plaque from the hands of Dr. H. M. Jolley, Canadian national president of the Alpha Omega Fraternity. "Especially since it is the first time the award has been made to a Cana-Dr. Albert Einstein was last year's winner.

Insulin Discoverer

Dr. Best, director of the Banting and Best department of medical research at the University of Toron-

to, worked with Dr. Banting to discover insulin. He has also discovenzyme histaminase, vitamin cholene and its effect on liver cirrhosis and the effect of heparin in preventing thrombosis.

Recently returned to his country home near Georgetown after a 40,000 mile world lecture tour, Dr. Best told delegates that there is still much dental work to be done in all parts of the world.

Paying tribute to the work of Alpha Omega, Dr. Best commented: "The leaders in dentistry are beginning to appreciate even more fully than in the past their opportunity to contribute through research to our knowledge of the

whole human body." Tooth Money

Dr. Best told about his father, a country doctor, who used to extract teeth at 50 cents each. This' was distributed among the Best household as 'tooth money."

Referring to the dental research division of the Banting and Best research division at the university, Dr. Best said that results obtained there by Dr. William Linghorne have already been "favourably received by dental research people in

many parts of the world." More than 1,000 delegates attended the convention. It was the first time since 1925 the group has chosen Toronto for meeting. With 8,000 members throughout Canada and the United States, the fraternity is setting its sights on a fund to set up a dental school in Israel. During World War II the group gathered, more than \$500,000 worth of dental supplies and equipment for use in refugee camps. It also furnished aid and personnel to the Israeli Army Dental Corps.
