### BARRIE MAN MEMBER OF OLD TOWN FAMILY

Found dead in his car after a heart seizure, James Drummond, 56, was buried in the family plot in Greenwood Cemetery here on Monday. He had been a resident of Barrie for several years.

He was the youngest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. James Drummond of Georgetown. His father operated a harness shop, in town for years which was located on Main Street. He learned the plumbing trade and worked in town with the late John Kennedy and Walter Anthony, and about thirty years ago he moved to Acton. He served overseas with the army in the first war, and was a member of the RCAF in the second war.
