Credit Issued to Medical Co-Op Members

For the first time, members of Halton Co-Operative Medical Services will have a loan unit credit from the surplus which has been built up. This was decided by the Board when discussing the financial statement and auditor's report at the Board of Directors meeting. Each member will be credited with his portion of the surplus until such a time as the fund has increased sufficiently to assure adequate protection, when it will be paid back to the members.

It was pointed out that the net earnings are the result of over-charge, and this is the correct way of treating it. In other words, if the premium rates turn out to be more than is necessary to carry the business in a sound manner, then the difference is credited to the members in keeping with the amount of premium paid per plan, and the members themselves will decide when such over-charge will be paid out.

Halton Co-Operative Medical Services, during the seven years of its existence, has increased its membership from 157 to nearly 1,100 members. That it has been able to build up a reserve which puts it on a sound basis is a matter of keen satisfaction to the members, who send in their renewals each year without any persuasion other than the usual renewal notice.

A Surgical Plan is now under consideration, and will be adopted as soon as sufficient applications are received. The Board says they would be happy to accept more members into their organization. They also consider they have done all they can to explain the Surgical Plan and say that unless people take to the idea the plan will have to be abandoned. An interesting fact is that the cost of the Surgical Plan amounts to about the same as some other plans charge for hospitalization services alone.

Close to 80 per cent of the people who enter hospital go there to have surgery, according to statistics compiled by Halton Medical Services. Of these people, the women make up the majority. Women between the ages of 30 and 50 years seem to be particularly susceptible to illness and the need for operations. Next on the sick list comes children under 15 years. Their expenses, of course, are seldom so high. After 60 years of age, both men and women often have heavy sickness bills.

At the Board of Directors meeting, considerable discussion also took place on Workmen's Compensation for farmers, and plans were made for G. J. Beach, of the Workmen's Compensation Board, to address an open meeting on the subject.
