**Outstanding Record of Peer Purebred Herd**

In the daily, weekly, and farm press there are often reports of outstanding records of production made by dairy cattle of various breeds. Here are some outstanding records made here in Halton, in the herd of G. Leslie Peer & Son, Milton R. 2. Six of the records are by daughters of their former herd sire, Moorebell Ormsby Fobes.

Hillandale Jane Fobes (V.G.) was first for milk and second for fat in the 1952 Honour List. As a Junior 4 year old in 365 days she produced 24,369 lbs. of milk and 902 lbs. B.F. Her mother Hillandale Janette Fobes also classified Very Good as a 5 year old in 365 days produced 26,713 lbs. milk and 993 lbs. butterfat; and as a 9 year old, 24,059 lbs. milk and 891 lbs. butterfat.

A sister of Jane, Hillandale Marilyn Fobes, was second for milk in the 1951 Honour List as a Senior 3 year old in 365 days with 21,175 lbs. milk and 743 lbs. butterfat. Another sister, Hillandale Ormsby Fobes, as a Junior 4 year old in 305 days was second for milk in the 1952 Honour List with 18,051 lbs. of milk and 616 lbs. butterfat. Still two other sisters finished with the following outstanding records:

Senior 3 yr. old in 365 days — 18,425 lbs. milk, and 698 lbs. butterfat; Senior 3 year old in 305 days 18,856 lbs. milk and 600 lbs. butterfat.

Two other outstanding records in the same herd by daughters of Man-O-War R. A. Major are as follows: Hillandale Fayne R.A., as a senior 3 year old on 2x in 365 days produced 20,102 lbs. milk and 833 lbs. butterfat; Hillandale Janette R.A., as a Junior 3 year old on 2x in 305 days produced 14,938 lbs. milk, with approximately 560 lbs. butterfat.

These are outstanding records in any herd. When one takes into consideration that the Hillandale herd is comparatively speaking, a small herd it is a real achievement.

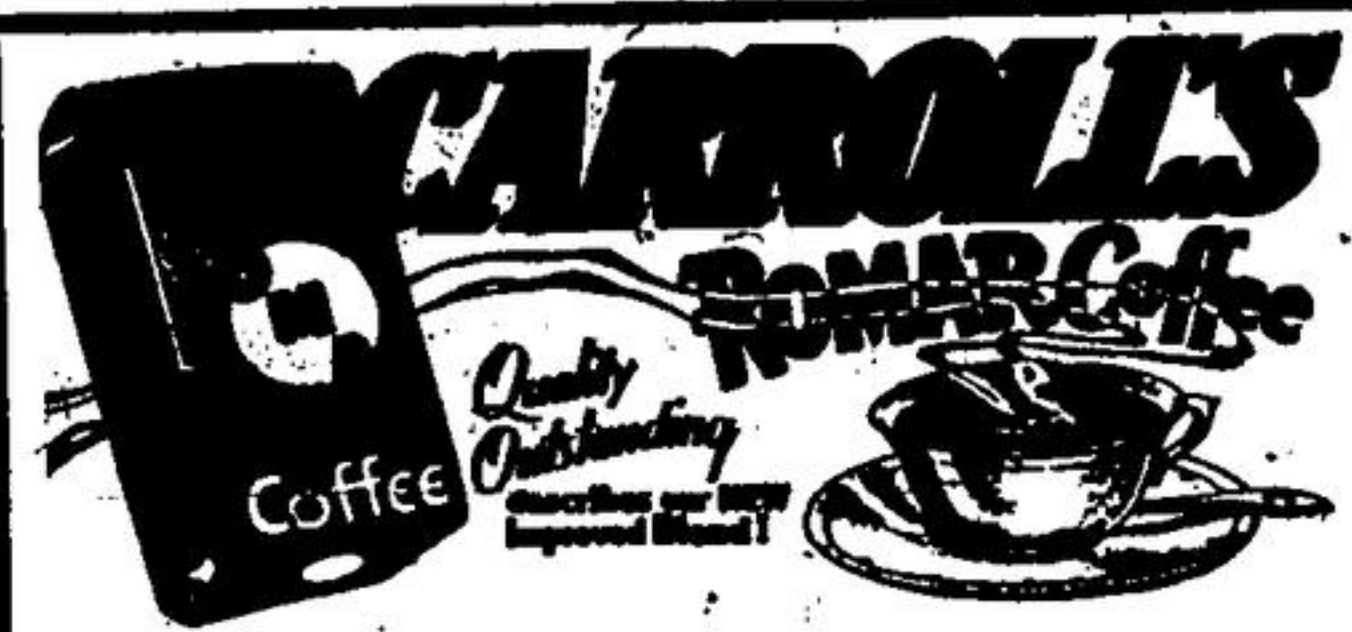
