### Olivet To Calvary St. John's Cantata

Last Sunday morning at St. John's United Church was Palm Sunday Communion service. At this service and the Preparatory Service on the previous Friday evening there were 21 new members received into full fellowship with the church.

Smith drew attention to Palm Sunday being the beginning of Passion Week, commemorating the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, and a week full of momentous happenings, ending in the crucifixion of Jesus, to be followed by His resurrection. Mr. Smith chose for his meditation the incident in that week of the Last Supper, in the upper room just before Jesus' death.

Henceforth, they would keep it as a new sacred rite, in remembrance of Him, as He had asked them to do, counting the bread and wine as symbols of His body, broken for them and His blood poured out for them, for the remission of their sins. As Mr. Smith told the boys and girls, we are many denominations but with the same God. A padre during the war, in the round of his duties, spoke kindly to a badly wounded young soldier. The soldier lifted himself a little and smiled; then still smiling, he noticed and said to the padre, "But you are of another denomination." "Yes, but even so, son, you belong to my God." And so it is, many ways, but the same God.
