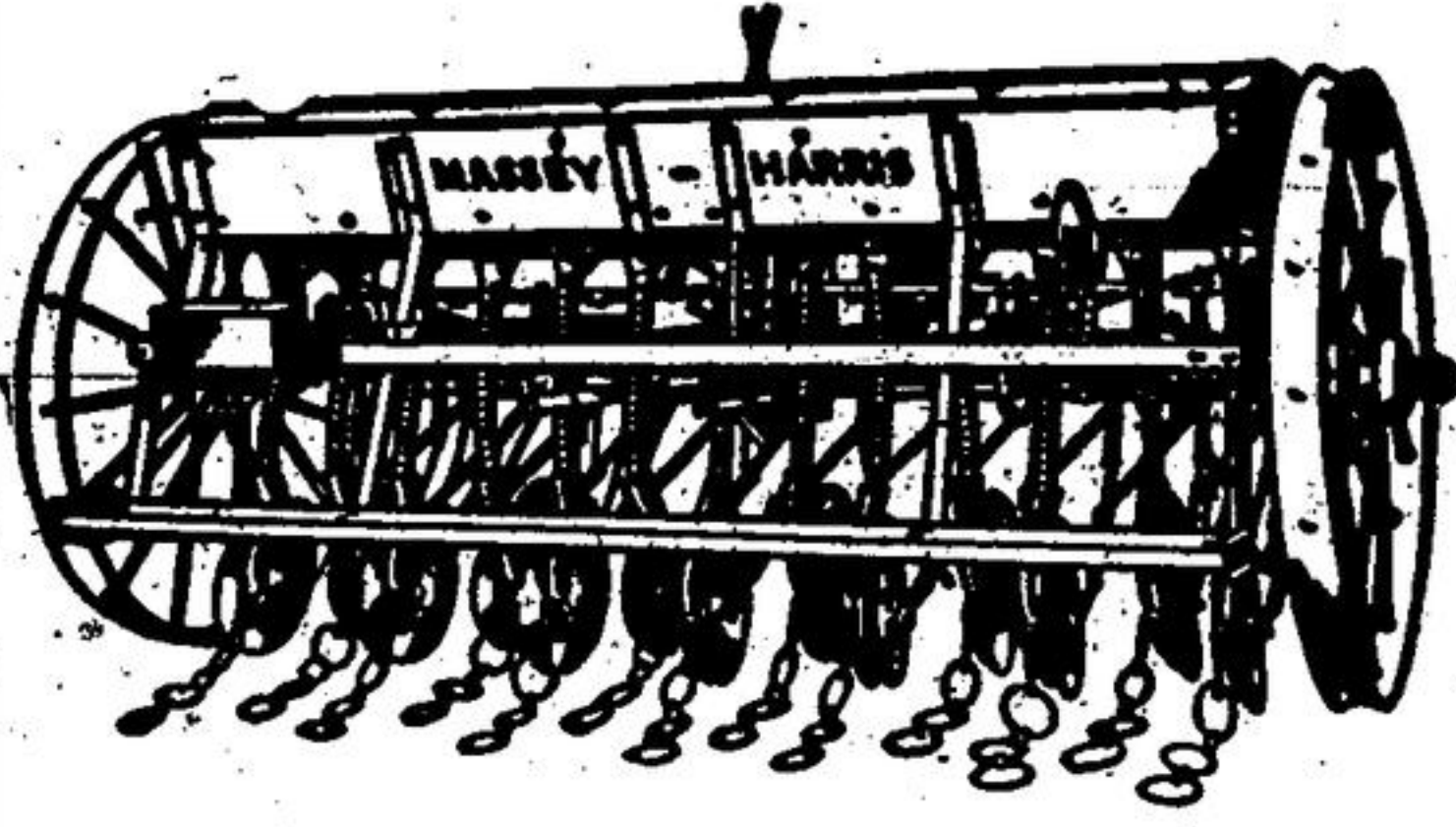

Mr. Allen, with Bob McMenemy and George Edmunds represented the local union at the meeting which was held at the King Edward Hotel.

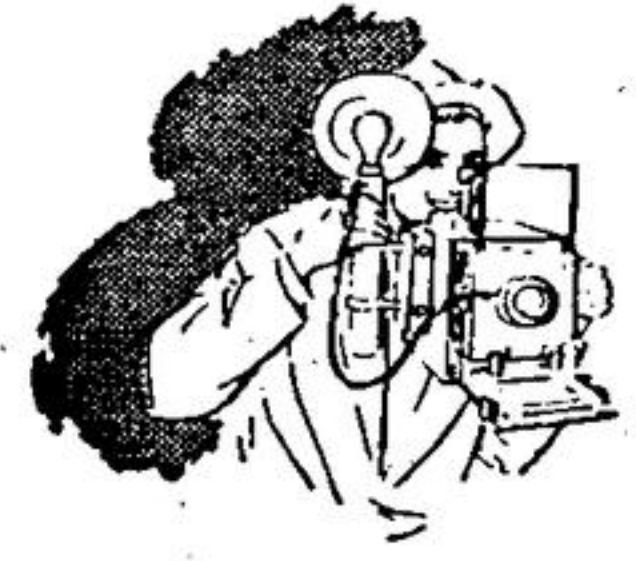
