Fire Fighting Equipment Demonstrated to Lions

Georgetown Lions Club saw a demonstration of fire fighting equipment and received some useful tips on fire prevention when they had some members of the fire brigade as their guests at last week's dinner meeting at the McGibbon House.
George Alexander, from the Fire Marshal's office, showed a movie which told what to do if trapped in a burning building, and stressed the fact that one should not "lose their head" in such an emergency. His talk on fire prevention also cleared some doubts about space heaters when he said that there is little danger when the heaters are properly operated and maintained.

Lion Chief Don Barrager introduced the evening's feature after the business meeting. Fire Chief William Hyde, Deputy Chief Jack Harlow, Harold Wilson and Charles Tyler were present and Mr. Hyde gave an explanation of the Scott Air-Pack and the resuscitator which the local brigade uses. Mr. Wilson demonstrated the resuscitator and Mr. Tyler the portable part of the machine.
