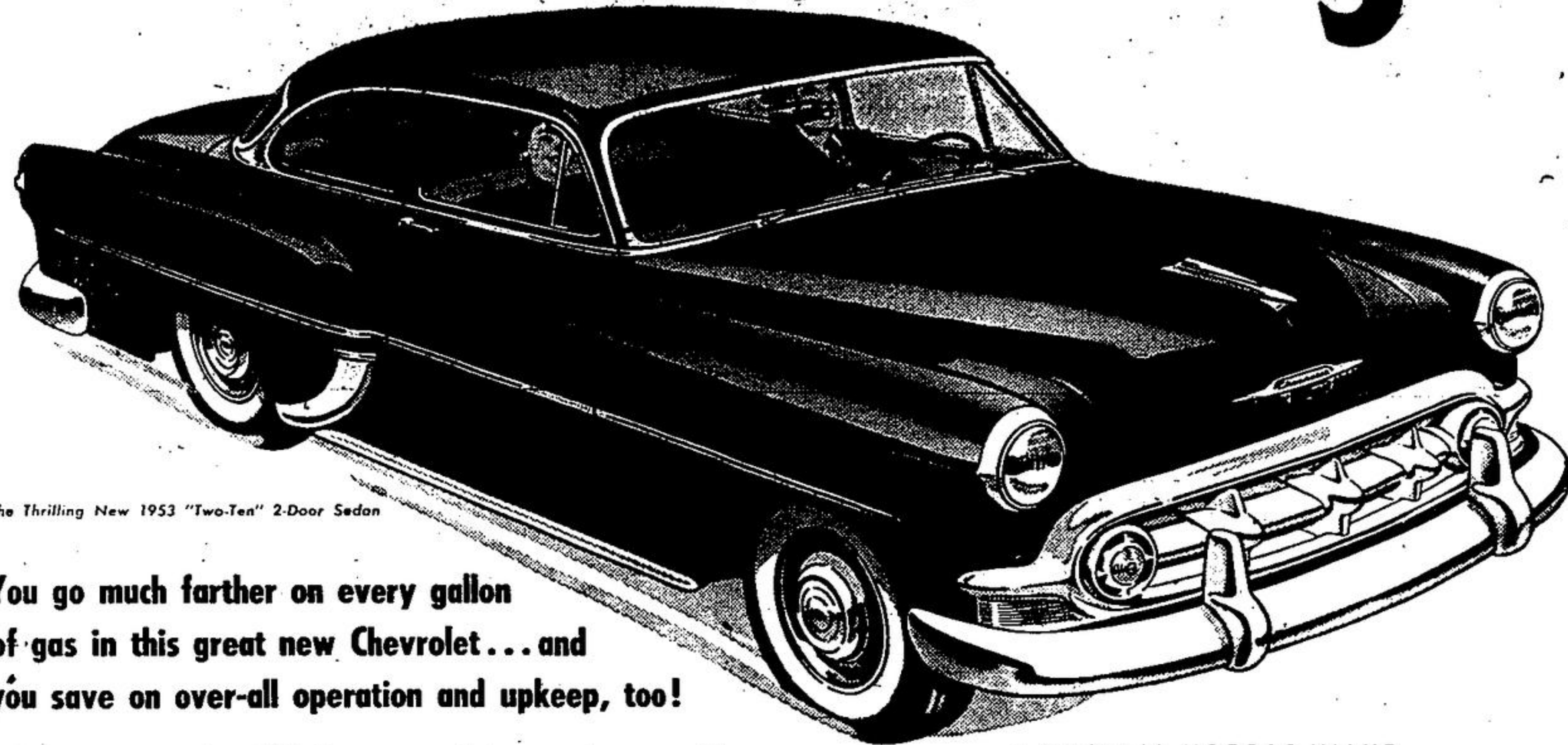
McMillan Presents Cup To Bracebridge Champs

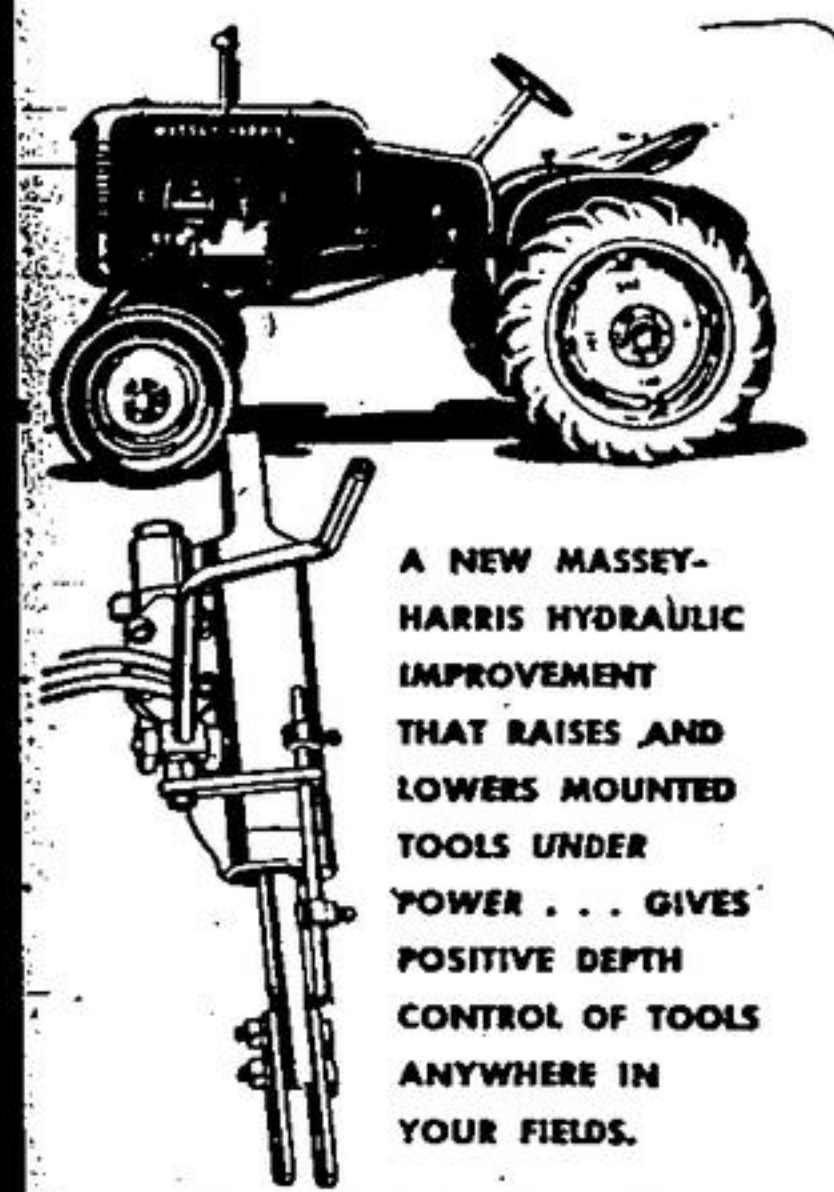
FIFTY LADIES ATTEND BRUSH DEMONSTRATION
