## Georgetown Native 63 Years in West

The death took place in Vancouver, B.C., on April 14th of Charles McKinnon Allen, 85.

Mr. Allen was born in Georgetown and was a son of the late Mr. and Mrs. William Allen, brother of William F. Allen, Toronto, and of the late John J. Allen, Georgetown. He is also survived by a daughter Valery, Mrs. Milton Kunst of Vancouver, B.C., and a son, Herbert Allen, Yorkton, Saskatchewan.

Mr. Allen left Georgetown for Western Canada sixty-three years ago. For many years he was assistant director of exhibits for the Canadian Pacific Railway and had travelled extensively throughout Canada, the United States, South America and the British Isles.

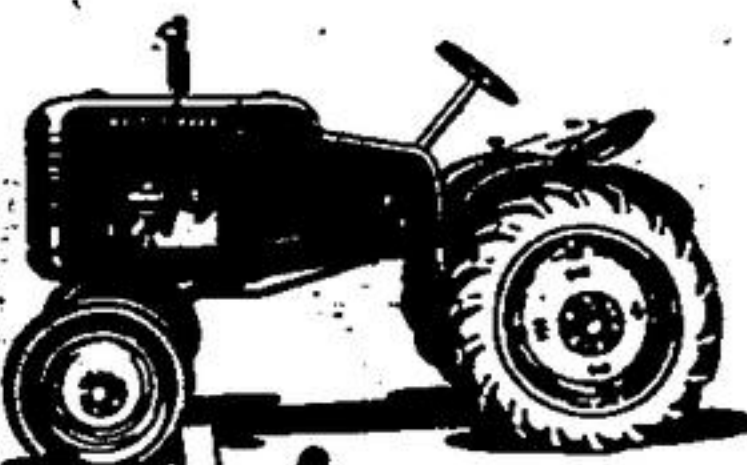

## Art College Director Tells Children of Art

On Friday afternoon, more than two hundred children of the senior rooms of the Georgetown Public Schools assembled in the auditorium of the Howard Wrigglesworth School. Mr. John Martin, ARCA, OSA, was present to address the children on art, and during the afternoon he demonstrated his technique with water colour dyes. The picture of two rowboats anchored on shore, painted by him in the demonstration, was presented to the Chapel Street School. Mr. Martin, one of Canada's outstanding painters and designers was introduced by Principal Harold Henry, who told the children of Mr. Martin's accomplishments.

Since 1945, Mr. Martin has been Director of Design at the Ontario College of Art, Toronto. His paintings hang in the National Art Gallery of Canada, the Vancouver Art Gallery, as well as the London and Portland galleries. During the summer month of July, Mr. Martin teaches at the School of Fine Arts at Doon, Ontario. A vote of thanks was tendered the artist for his greatly appreciated efforts by Miss Wilma Stull, a member of the staff.
