

Big Circus Coming to Guelph Next Week



There are 600 people travelling with the King Bros. and Christiani Combined Circus this season, in addition to 30 advance men. The performance is given in three rings, on two elevated stages, huge aerial enclaves and on giant hippodrome track. There are 150 performers, including the celebrated Christiani Family of riders with Lucio, the famous comedy star. The King Bros. and Christiani Combined Circus is now in its 33rd year. It has grown from a small show travelling on two railroad cars to its present eminence in the circus world.

A spectacular street parade will be given at 11 a.m. on the downtown streets circus day in Guelph next week. Rumbling wagons of red and gold, gaily caparisoned horses will be seen along with open cages and dens. Trumpeting bands and tooting calliopes, lumbering elephants and humping camels all form a part of the picturesque and spectacular street pageant.
