FAMILY ALLOWANCES IN PERIL IF DREW ELECTED . . McPHAIL

Speaking to a Liberal gathering in the Legion Hall last night, Murray McPhail, Liberal candidate for Halton County said that if by any stretch of the imagination George Drew and his followers were asked to form a government, the family allowances and other security measures would be in danger.

He pointed out that Mr. Drew is making wild promises of how he is going to cut taxation, but gives no substantial means of doing so. Fifty per cent of our taxes now go toward defence, twenty-five per cent for social services, and the balance to operate all the other services and administration. "He says he is not going to cut defence budgets, so look out for a cut in our family allowances or other pensions," said Mr. McPhail, "for he once called it an 'iniquitous legislation.'"

"The Liberal party are campaigning on their record, not promises," said Mr. McPhail. "A continuance of your prosperity depends on a Liberal administration. It isn't a mere political party but a 'way of life' for all Canadians."

In introducing the candidate, president W. G. Marshall of the Liberal Association urged everyone to get out and work for Murray McPhail a man who was born and raised on a farm in this county, and whose family roots go back in Halton County over 100 years. Mr. McPhail is not only a successful farmer but is also a successful businessman. There is no doubt but what Mr. St. Laurent and his government will be returned to Ottawa and Halton County could do no better than have Murray McPhail represent them there on the right side of the house.
