Hamilton Bishop Confirms Class of 32 Candidates

In the newly decorated St. Joseph's R.C. Church, Acton, a class of 32 candidates received the sacrament of confirmation from His Excellency Joseph F. Ryan, Bishop of Hamilton recently.

Holy Name men of St. Joseph's, Acton, and Holy Cross, Georgetown, formed a guard of honour for the bishop from the rectory to the church. The procession was led by altar boys, carrying the processional crucifix and the acolytes. Father V. J. Morgan met the bishop at the church entrance and conducted him to the sanctuary while the choir sang "Ecce Sacerdos Magnus." Following singing of the verses and responses by the clergy, Bishop Ryan sang the oration of the patron saint of the church, St. Joseph and gave his blessing to those assembled.

In an inspirational address, Bishop Ryan told of the need for more to study for vocations in the priesthood and sisterhood because of the tremendous growth of the church in Canada. He also spoke briefly on Catholic Action and congratulated those being confirmed on their sound knowledge of the Catechism.
