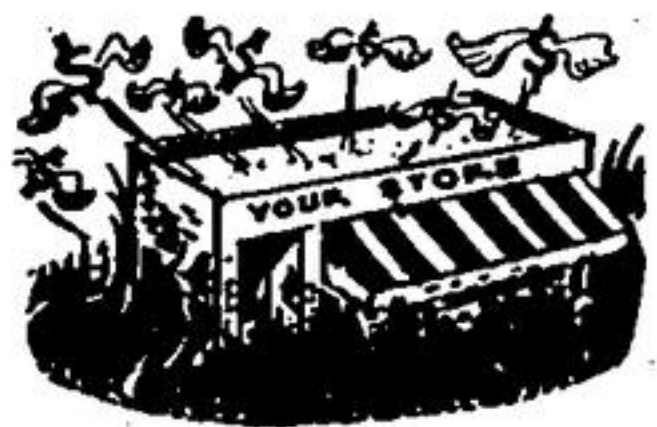

### COMMUNION SERVICE AT ST. JOHN'S CHURCH

It was Communion Service at St. John's United Church on Sunday morning and Rev. John M. Smith based his approach to the sacrament on the words of Jesus instituting the Lord's Supper. As Jesus broke bread and gave thanks He said — "This is My body broken for you." And likewise the cup when He had supped, saying "This is My blood in the new testament, shed for many for the remission of sins."

Many would think of this communion service, as just another church service, just another rite or sacrament observed; while others as they partake of the bread and wine will feel the significance of these symbols of the sacrifice of Christ; will know however good they thought they had been, or how much they had tried to live as they knew they should, they had still come a long way short of their Christian best, and that there was sin of omission and a commission spoiling their true harmony and concord with God, and that the sacrifice of Jesus was God's way of forgiveness for us, and His means of showing His continued love and concern.

Mr. Smith quoted some passages of scripture to show the heart of God and His dealing with us. His way of bringing us back to His fold and the way by which we can attain our highest desire, the abundant life here, and with it Life Eternal. 1. "All have sin and come short of the Glory of God." Serious thinking about the deep meaning of the institution of the Communion Sacrament, should make us know the truth of this. 2. "God so loved the world that He gave."
