This will be my last article of the campaign series for in a few days, you, the men and women of Halton County will cast your votes in another Federal election. During the past few weeks I have called on many hundreds of you in your homes and in the industries but there are still many more on whom I shall not have the opportunity to call through lack of time. This has been a rich and invigorating experience bringing me into close touch with the home, the social and industrial problems of the county. The potentialities of Halton County are unlimited and we must prepare for vast and immediate developments.

In discussing the election during my calls I find that there are four issues uppermost in the minds of the people of this county and they are taxation, adequate housing at a price within the reach of young fathers and mothers and those in lower wage and salary brackets, contributory health insurance and the decline of farm produce prices with the loss of farm markets.

The Conservative Party if elected says it can and it will give the Canadian people an immediate tax cut of \$500,000,000.00 by frugal common sense administration of business and by ceasing to budget for surpluses which have taken from the people of Canada for the last six years \$1,000,000 a day more than the Government needed. Let me say it again and once for all that there will be no reduction in Old Age Pensions or Family Allowance and our Defence Program will be maintained at its present level.

We will introduce a housing program that will enable people with smaller incomes to buy property and build new homes on an outlay of about thirty to forty dollars a month. There will be a new set of rules for building and purchasing a new home. With the cooperation of Provincial and Municipal authorities more fully serviced land will be made available for building.

The Progressive Conservative Government will call a Dominion-Provincial Tax Conference immediately to discuss revisions in our whole system of taxation. We will seek substantial reductions in taxes on homes and farm lands for education, health and other essential services. This is vitally essential for this County of Halton in view of our tremendous increase in population.

We plan to inaugurate a contributory health insurance program in cooperation with the Provinces to assure every Canadian proper medical and surgical care. This program will recognize existing medical insurance plans and will provide the medical services Canada requires without bringing in state medicine.

For the first time in Canada's history we are in the midst of a slump in foreign trade that is making our export problem a serious national liability. Canada, the third largest trading nation in the world, now faces a trade crisis which all the Liberal government oratory and gifts writing of its candidates cannot conceal. The income of the average one hundred acre farm will be reduced this year by approximately \$1,000.00 and behind this critical situation facing the Canadian farmer is a long story of ineptitude bungling and bad bargaining. The

Conservative Party will take immediate steps to restore and expand world markets for Agriculture and other primary products.

As your Progressive Conservative candidate for Halton I pledge my full time and effort to serving your needs if I am elected on Monday. I know Halton County and its problems very well coming from a family that has lived here for over one hundred and fifty years. During the sixteen years that I have been a practicing lawyer in Georgetown I have been actively concerned with the problems of this county's farmers, industrial workers, merchants, professional people and yes, the housewives too. I know your problems; I earn my living here and my business, social and other interests are here in Halton County. Paris Minister Preaches At St. John's This Month

While Rev. Alex Calder and Rev. John M. Smith are on holiday during August, the congregation of Knox Presbyterian Church and St. John's United Church, are worshipping together; the first three Sundays in St. John's and the last two in Knox.

For the three Sundays in St. John's, the guest minister is Rev. Royal E. Newman, who has just retired from active ministry after 40 years of service, a service which was suitably recognized at the Hamilton Conference in June, at the same session in which Rev. Wm. Gibb of Ballinafad was ordained into the ministry. Some will remember Mr. Newman as the minister who baptized Mr. and Mrs. Smith's daughter, Margaret.

At the service on Sunday morning Mr. Newman was especially free and happy with the boys and girls and used an ordinary pin to illustrate his talk to them. Like a pin he told them they had a head, and asked them to learn to use it right, and well. Like a pin, they should have a point and purpose in life and learn to pursue it faithfully. Like a pin they should be straight and upright, only doing that which was honest and fair, and of which they need never be ashamed.

For his scripture and in his meditation, Mr. Newman used the words of Jesus in John 14, 1 to 15, "Let not your heart be troubled, in My Father's House are many mansions, I go to prepare a place for you, I am the way, the truth and the life." He quoted a line from the children's hymn which had just been sung, as being the theme of his sermon "For our lives but just begun," and said that though he had retired from the active ministry, he felt that for his life, it was a new era just begun, and that many experiences of our lives could be that as we looked ahead and gained new insight into greater things yet to be accomplished. He noted that the Christian life was often rugged and strenuous with its share of pain and sacrifice, but that Jesus even with the cross before Him, with its agony and suffering, did not concentrate his thoughts on these, but rather, with His great insight, thought of what he would be able to accomplish for mankind, bringing the children of earth to a knowledge of the love and mercy of their Heavenly Father, showing unto them the way, the truth, and the life, and pointing them to the many mansions of His Father's House, prepared for them.

He cited Daniel dismissing the thought of punishment in the lion's den, praying earnestly three times a day, with his windows open to Jerusalem, so that he could get light and strength for his path, and an insight into what might lie beyond his faithfulness to His God. Moses too ignored the struggle and disappointments, steadfastly doing his duty, with an insight that God had something greater than just Moses' task that He wanted done. God chose these men and many others because He knew they had more in them than they themselves thought they had.
