DIES WHILE PLANNING GEORGETOWN VISIT

On July 17th, Max Yaworski died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Hamilton. The late Mr. Yaworski was to have left that morning for a week's visit in Georgetown with Mr. and Mrs. John S. Harris, his son-in-law and daughter, when he was suddenly taken ill. He was removed to the hospital where he died shortly after admittance.

A Ukrainian, born in 1883 in a village near Lwow in the Austrian Ukraine, he served three years in the Imperial Austrian army prior to coming to Canada in 1908. He settled in Toronto where he married Anna Urbanski who predeceased him twenty-eight years ago.

In 1923 they took up farming about 11 miles north of Cobourg. He retired in 1950 and went to live with Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Bullivant his son-in-law and daughter.

Besides his two daughters, Jessie and Ola he also leaves a son Donald in Kirkland Lake and five grandchildren Christine, David and Arthur Yaworski of Kirkland Lake and Max and Joan Harris of Georgetown.

Funeral was in St. Michael's Church, Cobourg, for requiem mass and interment at Centreon Cemetery.
