**Mackenzie Contractor Milton School Addition**

J. B. Mackenzie & Son, Georgetown, already booked to build a new high school in Acton and a high school addition in Georgetown, have been awarded the contract for building a one room addition to Milton high school.

The Mackenzie tender of \$19,710 was the lowest of three received by North Halton school board at a meeting last Wednesday in Milton.

Other tenders were James Kemp, \$19,811 and W. A. Brown, \$22,710.

Originally tenders had been called for a two room addition at Milton, but prices were far in excess of the \$20,000 budget, and the Dept. of Education frowned on building a basement room. Revised tenders were then called for.

At Georgetown, in view of the cost exceeding a \$120,000 budget, negotiations for purchasing adjoining land owned by Jack Tost have been discontinued for the present by the school board.

A request from Bowes Baptist Church for use of Milton school auditorium for Sunday school classes was turned down, as the board felt that caretaking and other problems would make it impracticable.

A request from the town of Acton for a street right of way through the high school property there was turned down, as this would isolate a 50-foot strip of school grounds and would reduce the grounds below a minimum limit.

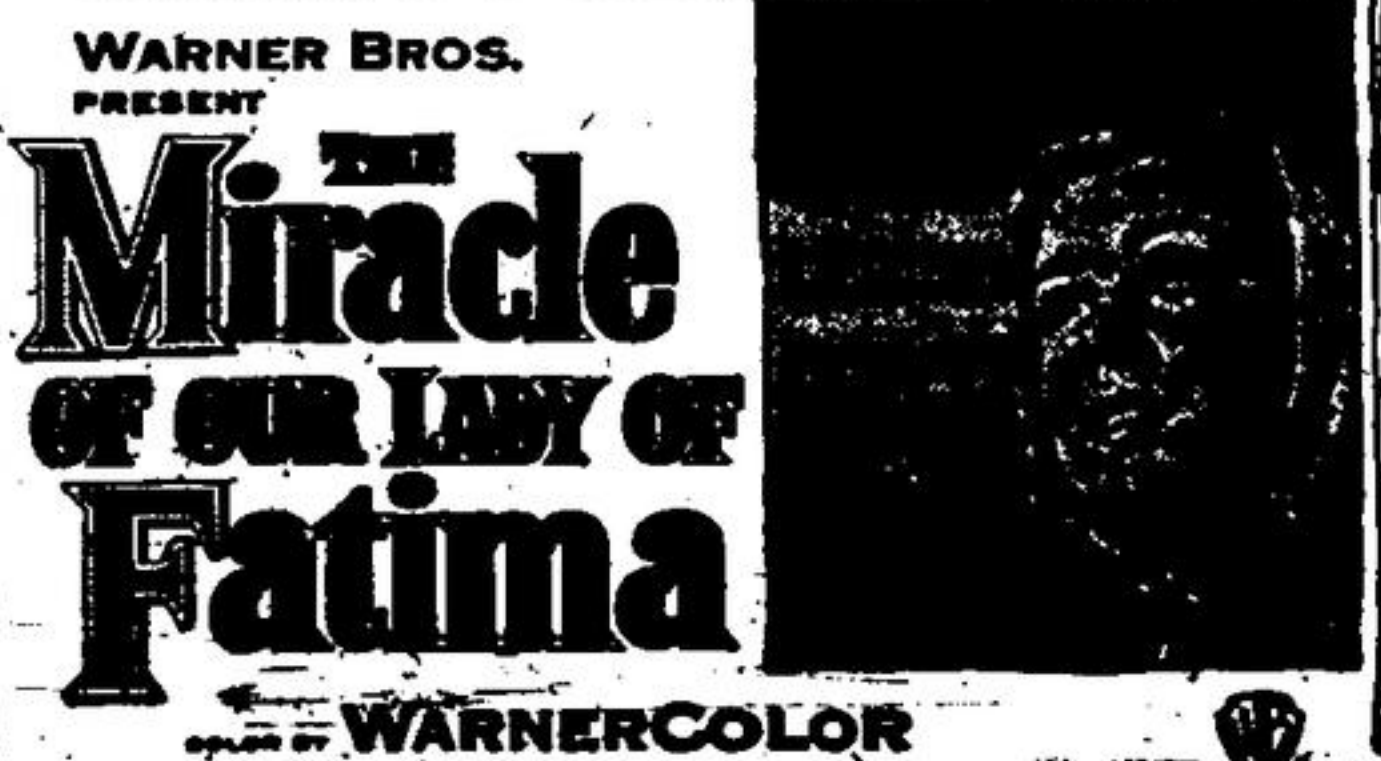
