The Georgetown N&G's wound up the regular schedule in their group with a convincing 17-8 win over Wallaceburg Red Devils in an intermediate OLA game at the arena Friday night.

The game was a preview of the play-offs as these two clubs meet in a four-out-of-seven series for the right to continue on in intermediate B competition.

The locals started fast and held a 6-1 lead at the end of the first period. The pace slackened in the second and third quarters, the locals outscoring the visitors 5-4 to lead 11-5 at the three quarter mark. In the last period the Red Devils ran in three fast counters and looked to have the N&G's on the run. With Caruso and Foster sitting out five minute penalties for fighting, Zeke McCandless took over. He rammed in three markers in less than two minutes and cooled the visitors off. The N&G's added three more before

the end of the game to wind up on the long end of a 17-8 count. Zeke McCandless who must have had sights adjusted was the chief triggerman for the N&G's.

With submarine shots working to perfection, he fired seven counters. Len Caruso and Junior Beaumont scored three apiece. Doug Townsend and Bill Louth each scored two. Ridgewell with three, Momney, Foster, McGrathy, Emery and Kelly with singles were the Wallaceburg scorers.

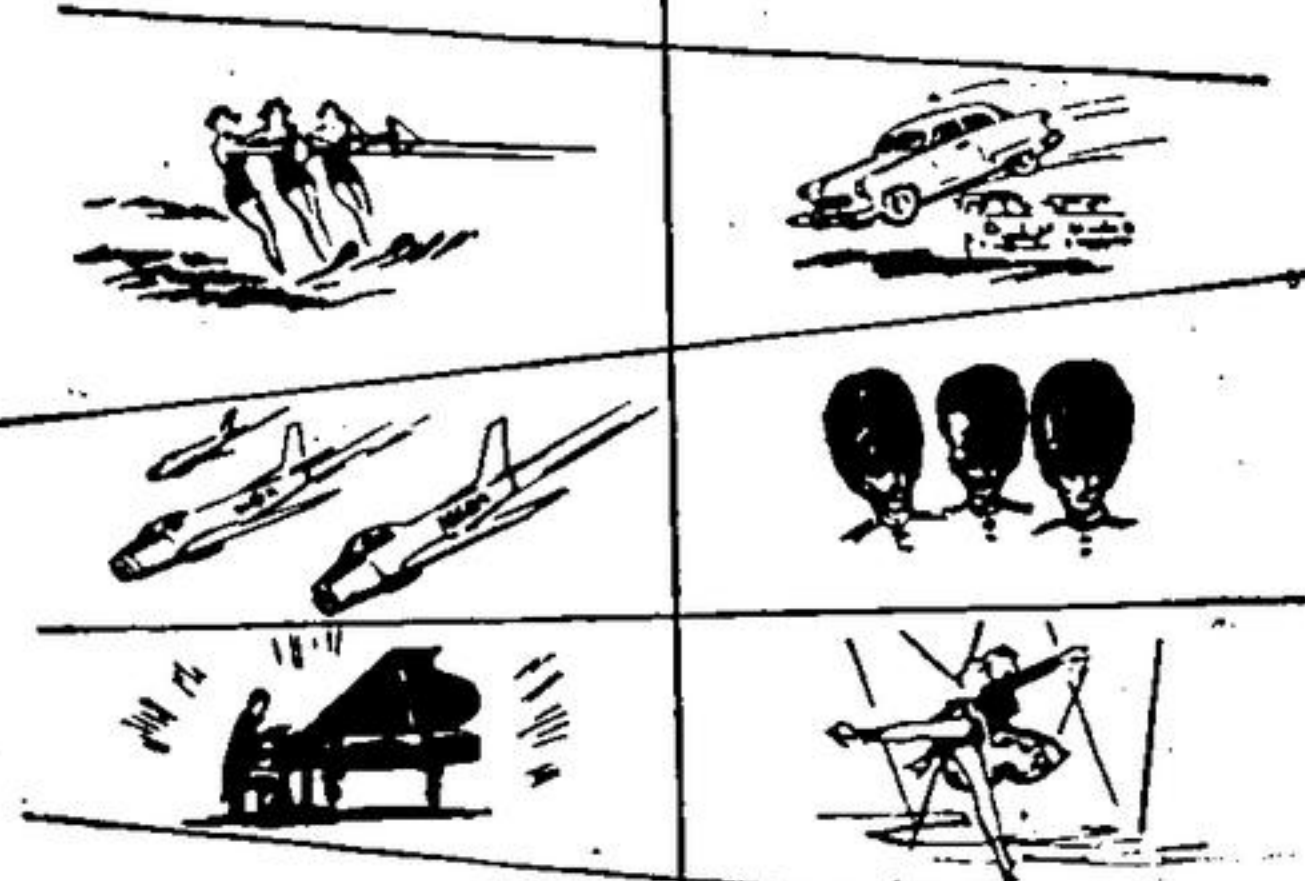
