The coliseum and cattle barns were like furnaces — as result the ringside was much below normal. Halton was represented in three breeds, Holstein, Jersey, and Guernsey, and in all these breeds, Halton may well be proud of the result of their efforts.

Hunter and Sherwood Get Reserve Hunterholme R.A. Supreme took the red ribbon in a strong class ten two year old bulls for Messrs. A. G. Hunter and M. C. Sherwood of Nelson Township. This great bull bred and exhibited by Mr. Hunter went on to take both the reserve senior and reserve grand championships — the grand championship for males went to last year's CNE champion, Illehee Sovereign Supreme owned and exhibited by H. C. McCloskey of York County. Black and White breeders will get a greater appreciation of this Halton achievement when they realize this meant beating J. M. Fraser's Spring Farm Fond
