### No Curiosity Calls Phone Company Plea

Georgetown telephone users were asked this week to cooperate in ensuring that the conversion to dial operation is completed smoothly. W. O. Misener, Bell Telephone manager for this area, asked subscribers not to place 'curiosity calls' or other unnecessary calls at or near cutover time. The switchover will be made at about 7 a.m. Sunday — a time when the volume of calls being handled by the local exchange is usually

light. A few minutes before that time, operators in the old manual exchange will start asking persons placing calls to call a few minutes later, using the dial. The change-over is expected to take less than two minutes to complete.
