

Pink Supplement Gives New Triangle Numbers

Because all Georgetown telephone numbers will be changed when the exchange is converted to dial operation on Sept. 20th, a special supplementary directory has been mai-


led to subscribers here. Printed on pink paper, the supplement replaces the original Georgetown section of the current directory, and will be in effect until the next regular directory is distribu-

There is a gummed edge on the supplement to enable subscribers to attach it over page one of the present directory.

W. O. Misener, Bell Telephone manager here, cautions subscribers not to use the supplement until the switchover takes place, but after that to consult it before dialing. Instructions on how to use the dial telephone are contained on the front cover of the supplement. Also listed there are Bell Telephone service numbers, and the numbers for the police and fire departments.

After the conversion to dial, all Georgetown telephone numbers will consist of the prefix, TRiangle 7, followed by four figures, For local calls, however, it will be necessary to dial only the last four figures.

C.N.R. TO BUILD BIG HOTEL IN MONTREAL - Plans for the construction of a large convention hotel on the Central Station site in Montreal have been approved by the Canadian National Railways board of directors and will be included in the railway's budget when it is submitted to the sessional parliamentary committee on railways as part of the financial programme to be laid before Parliament at the next session. Donald Gordon, chairman and president, has announced. The 20-storey, \$20,000,000 hotel will have upwards of 1,000 rooms and convention space capable of senting 4,000 persons at meetings and 2,500 at banquets. It will benefit all agencies engaged in the travel and tourist industry and will do much to attract conventions and visitors to Canada, and will be of great and direct benefit to Montreal, the Province of Quebec and Canada

The architect's drawing shows the new hotel facing on Dorchester Street (left) and Mansfield Street (right.) At the far left of the sketch is the present International Aviation Building, also owned by the C.N.R., and an idea of the size of the new hotel is to be had by comparing the bulk of the two buildings. Between the hotel and the Aviation Building is a sketch of the new headquarters office building which is planned for later development. The hotel is part of a carefully-conceived terminal area development plan which has been under discussion between the railway and the city of Montreal for several years. When completed by the C.N.R. and private capital the development will rival in scope that of the world-famous Rockefeller Center in New York.




