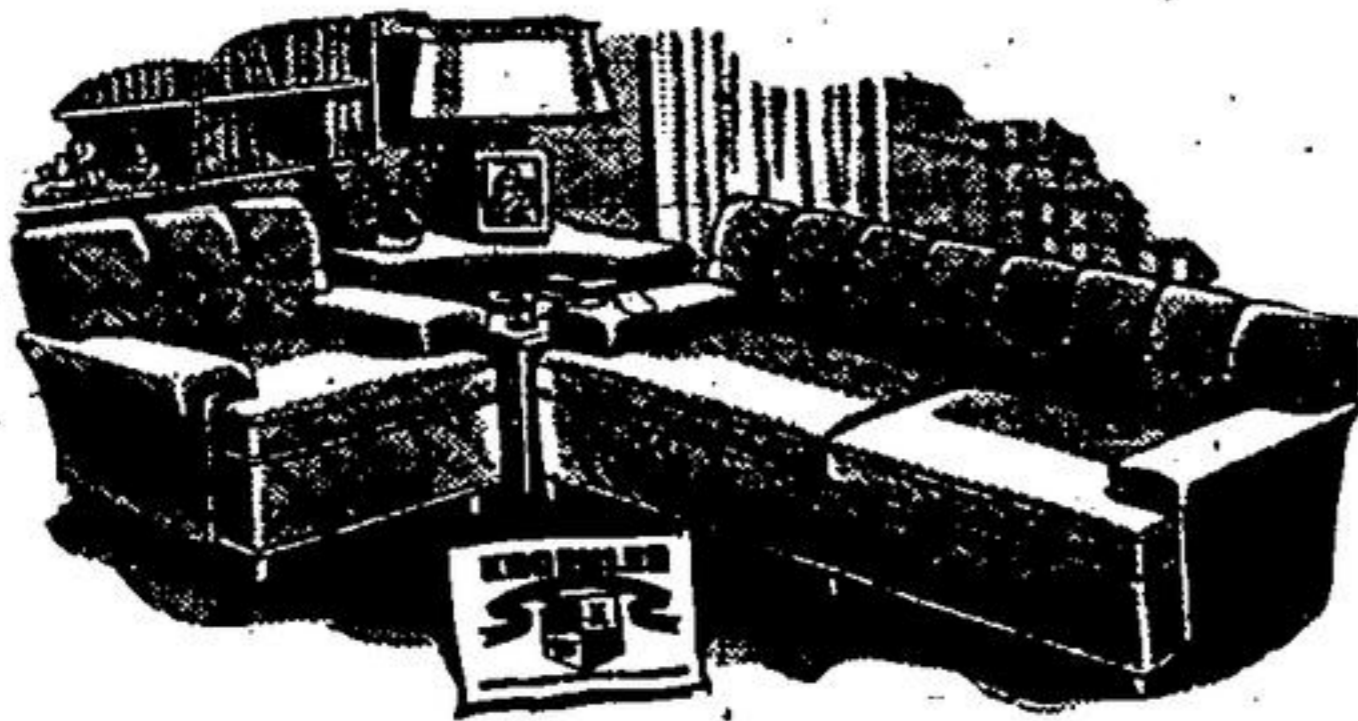

Mark Anniversary Of Baptist Church

On Sunday, September 27th the Georgetown Baptist Church celebrated its 100th anniversary. Rev. Alfred E. Kitchen, of Maitland St. Baptist Church, London, was guest preacher and delivered very challenging sermons which stimulated and vitalized the hearts of the large number of people who attended.

At the morning worship Mr. Kitchen spoke on "Good Tidings" — the claim of the Christian gospel is good news and great joy. The gospel if properly lived is the true essence of Christianity and brings joy to the heart of the believer. Christianity if properly grasped is exciting and dramatic — it is the abundant life. He pointed out that God became man and entered into man's experience as a man. The power of God made the world's greatest tragedy into the world's great triumph.

At the evening service, Mr. Kitchen centered his theme upon the eternal question asked by the Philippian jailer to Paul and Silas who had been imprisoned, found in Acts 16:30-31, "And brought them out, and said Sirs, What must I do to be saved. And they said Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ and thou shalt be saved." Here we see Christ is God seeking man. Sin is something which is real and living. Salvation is never a solitary thing but we must commit ourselves onto the Lord Jesus Christ and we shall be saved.

Special music was provided by the guest soloist, Mr. Gwilym Evans, Brampton, who chose as his selections: Open the Gates of the Temple, The Holy City, the Lord is my Shepherd, and Abide with Me, and also by the choir under Mrs. W. Townsend's direction. The anthems were Samuelson's arrangement of "Green Pastures" and "O Come Let us Sing Unto The Lord" arranged by Caleb Simper.

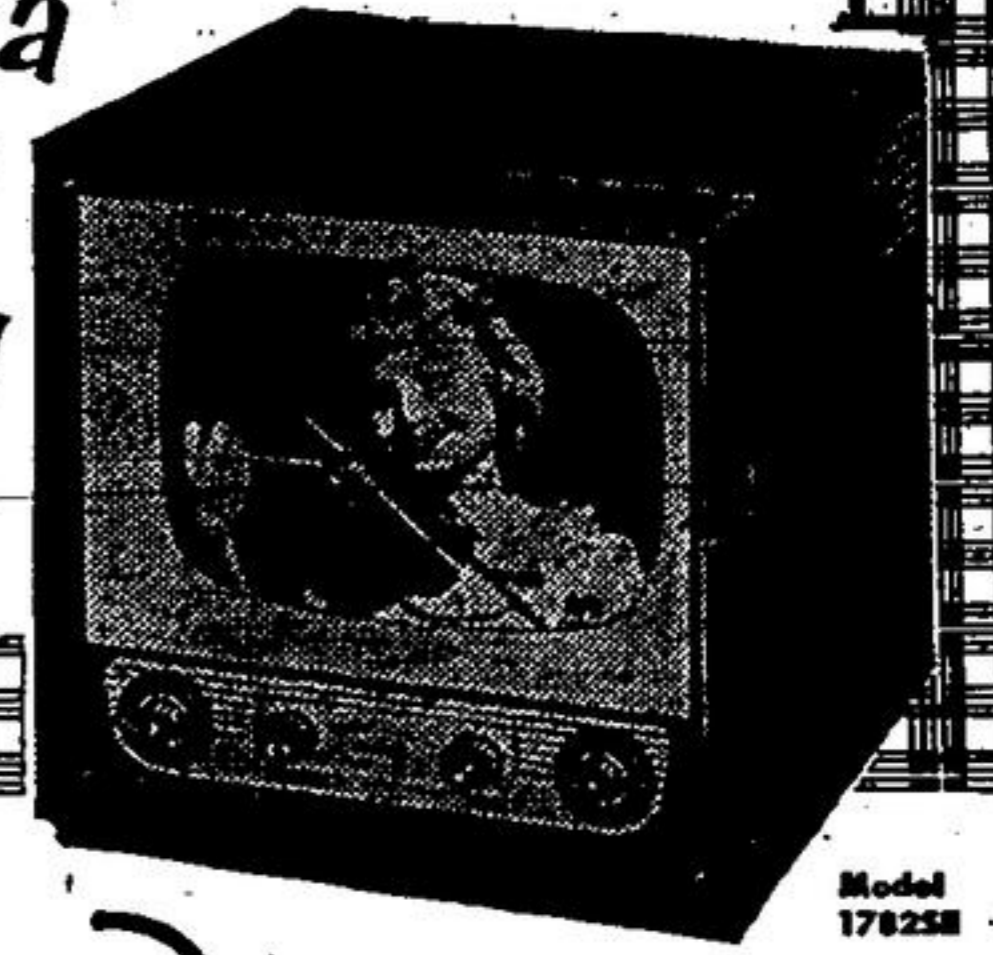

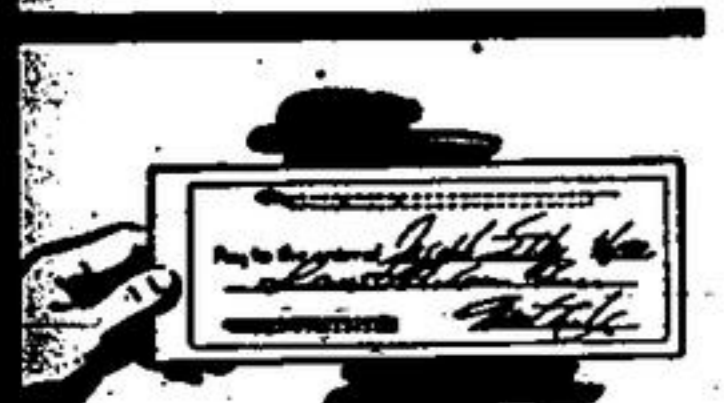
