MUNICIPAL BOARD REFUSES ACTON ANNEXATION REQUEST

The application of the Town of Acton for annexation of approximately 300 acres of Esqueing land has been dismissed by the Ontario Municipal Board. The hearing of evidence before the Municipal Board was held in June and the ruling dated September 14th explains in conclusion that "Other than financial gain to the Town there has been no sound reason for annexation presented to the Board and this gain must be at the expense of the Township. There does not appear to be any real support of the application by the owners in the area. The application will therefore be dismissed."

The greater part of the lands in the one parcel on which application was made is owned by Beardmore and Co. The four page ruling points out that the area contains part of the company's buildings as well as the Wool Combing plant, Acton water pumping station sewage disposal plant and garbage dump. "Both the plants are supplied with water and electric power from the Town of Acton systems," the report states. "Of the workers employed at the plants, about 80 per cent reside in Acton and the town provides school accommodation for the families of these workers... It is admitted that the sale of electrical energy is made at a small profit to the system, as is the sale of water, and that the existence of the two large industries as water consumers has made possible the expansion and improvement of the waterworks system," the report emphasizes.

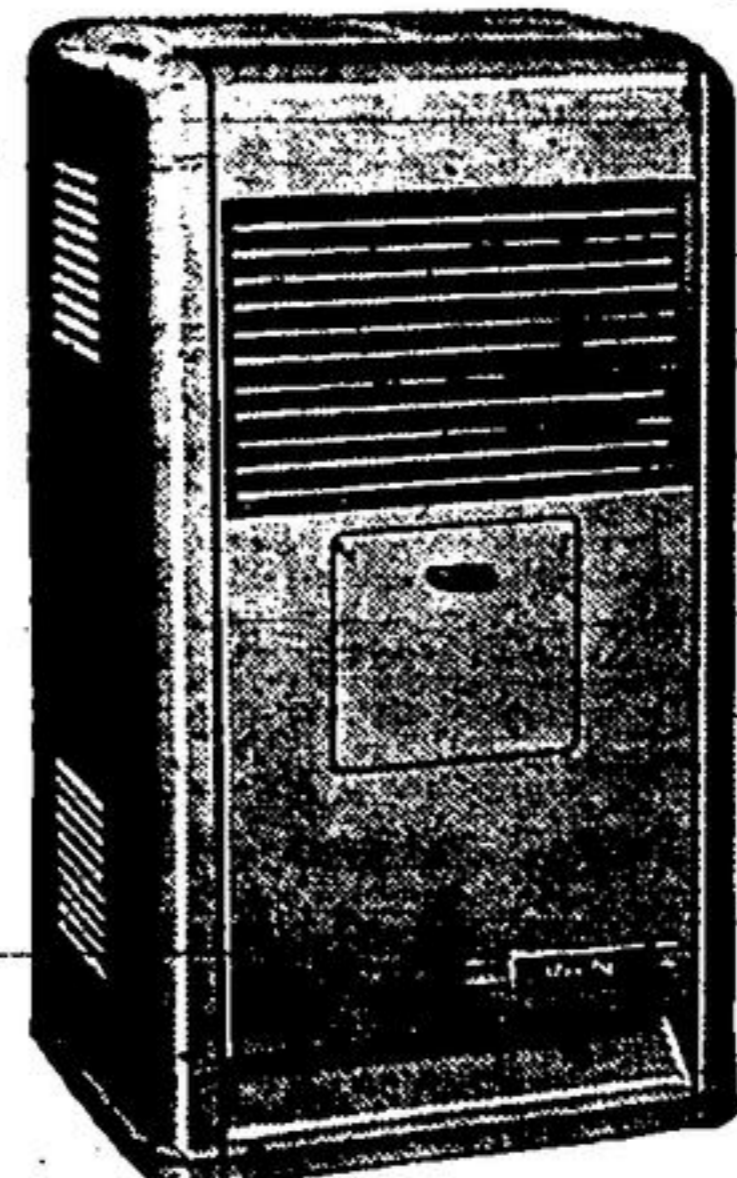
