### United Church Marks World Wide Communion

Last Sunday was World Wide Communion Sunday and it was fittingly observed as such at St. John's United Church, with the Rev. John M. Smith taking the service and being assisted by Rev. Royal E. Newman in the reading of the Scripture lesson and in prayer.

In every part of Canada and in some part of nearly every land of the globe, Christians were holding this service as believers in the One God, One Christ, doing as Christ asked of them: "This do in remembrance of Me." This is the faith in which we live, and if sincere and steadfast in which we die.

And as we think of the worldwide nature of this day's observance, we can feel assured, we are not alone, but rather of a vast communion, a widespread Christian fellowship.

Mr. Smith's communion meditation was: "The Cross, the Cup, the Crowd." We need to look again at the cross, for it is the symbol and evidence of God's love for His world, His concern for His creatures, His willingness to do His Father's will at whatever sacrifice, for the saving of God's children. An old, rugged cross, but not just any cross; this a very special one, the emblem of suffering and shame, yet for which we too should be willing to give our all. This emblem of love and mercy, so often high on church spires, on cathedrals, emblazoned on their walls, and windows everywhere, is, better still, emblazoned on hearts and minds the world over.

And the cup, emblem of Christ's shed blood. As He asked of us to drink of the Cup with Him and in His name, it was with this recognition and acceptance of His blood shed for the remission of sin, and the redeeming of mankind. And those who take the cup in their hands and drink, acknowledge their acceptance of Christ as their Saviour and Lord, and as His followers, also accept their share of His work and anxiety for the world's redemption.

And the crowd, truly a mingling of some believers, of some curious, some hostile, many needy physically and spiritually, many wishing within themselves that they could know the truth and find the way. And the same crowd is with us today, many believers, many curious, some doubtful, many needy, body, mind and spirit, wishing they knew the truth and the way.

### Toronto Broker Builds Luxury Home in Inglewood

Inglewood has been selected by S. K. Bongard, Toronto stockbroker, whose wife is the former Helen Lawson of Georgetown, as the site for his new \$135,000 home which is to be built by the Town and Country Construction Co., Brampton. Building on the luxury home is to begin immediately.

The house, of single storey structure, is designed in a U-shape, with the front measuring 101 feet, the left wing 70 feet and the right wing 94 feet.

Rooms in the ultra modern home will include five bedrooms, four bathrooms, a powder room, kitchen and a huge living room. Three of the bedrooms will measure 12 by 16 and the two master bedrooms will be 17 by 22 and 18 by 22. The kitchen will be built to a scale of twelve by 17 and will include all the latest kitchen equipment.

A spokesman for the construction company said the building will take about 30 weeks to complete.

"The contract is for \$135,000, but it will cost more than that to complete the house. The contract does not include work on the stone front of the house, interior decorating or landscaping the property," the spokesman said. "It will cost more like \$160,000 when finished," he said.

With the exception of the front of the house, which will be constructed of special stone, the building will be of brick construction. The living room across the front of the house, will measure 60 feet long by 32 feet wide. Marani and Morris, Toronto, are the architects.
