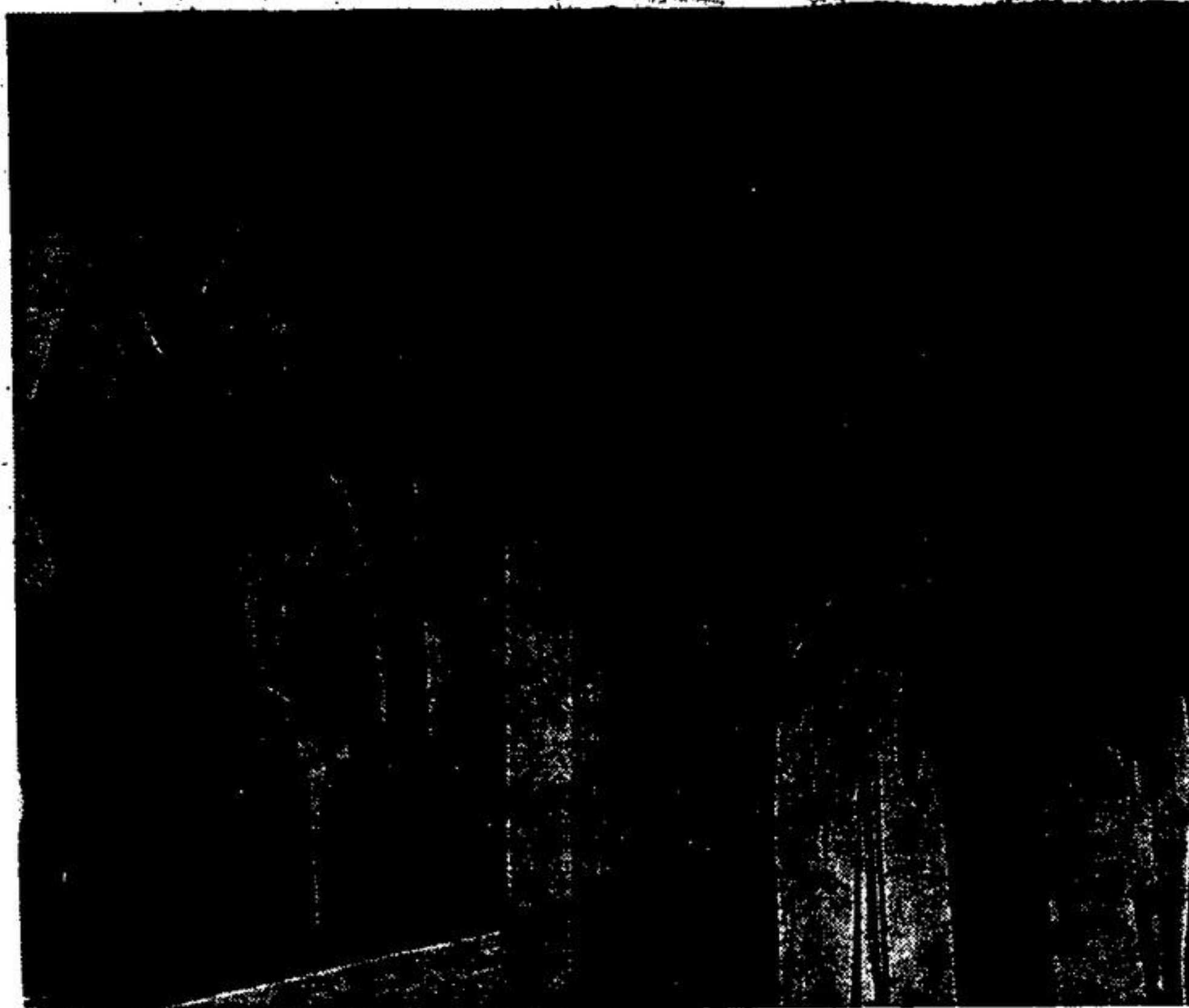

Limehouse Native Dies at Vancouver
Descendant of a pioneer Esqueving family, Mrs. Minnie Nickell Graham of Winnipeg died recently at her niece's home in Vancouver.
Mrs. Graham was a descendant of William Nickell who emigrated from Ireland in 1812 and was the third settler in Esqueving, taking up land at Dolly Varden which remained in the family name until this year.
Daughter of James Nickell and Sarah Woods, she was born at Limehouse. Her husband, Charles Graham died several years ago. A brother, John W. Nickell of Eden Mills, is the only surviving member of the family.
She was predeceased by brothers and sisters, Mrs. Hugo Bell, Toronto, William Nickell, Sarnia, Dr. Robert Nickell, Georgetown, James Nickell who died a year ago and Mrs. E. R. Weatherill, Toronto who died in April.
