**AIR CRASH VICTIM  
BURIED AT NORVAL**

An air crash at Kenora a week ago Sunday killed two Navy fliers one of them a member of a prominent Norval family.

Lieutenant George Noble who was piloting a Navy Avenger aircraft home towards Summer side, P.E.I., after a cross country training flight, and another crew member died in the flaming wreckage, while three others escaped. The plane had signalled for an emergency landing, and crashed just as it reached the Kenora landing strip.

Lieut. Noble was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Warwick H. Noble. His father, a Toronto lawyer, is the son of Dr. R. T. Noble and nephew of Lt.-Col. A. L. Noble of Norval. Full naval honors were accorded at the funeral service in Timothy Eaton Memorial Church last Friday morning, and interment was made later in the Noble family plot in Hillcrest Cemetery, Norval.

Lieut. Noble is survived by his wife, Elaine Burtwell, who lives in Halifax, N.S. and his parents in Toronto.

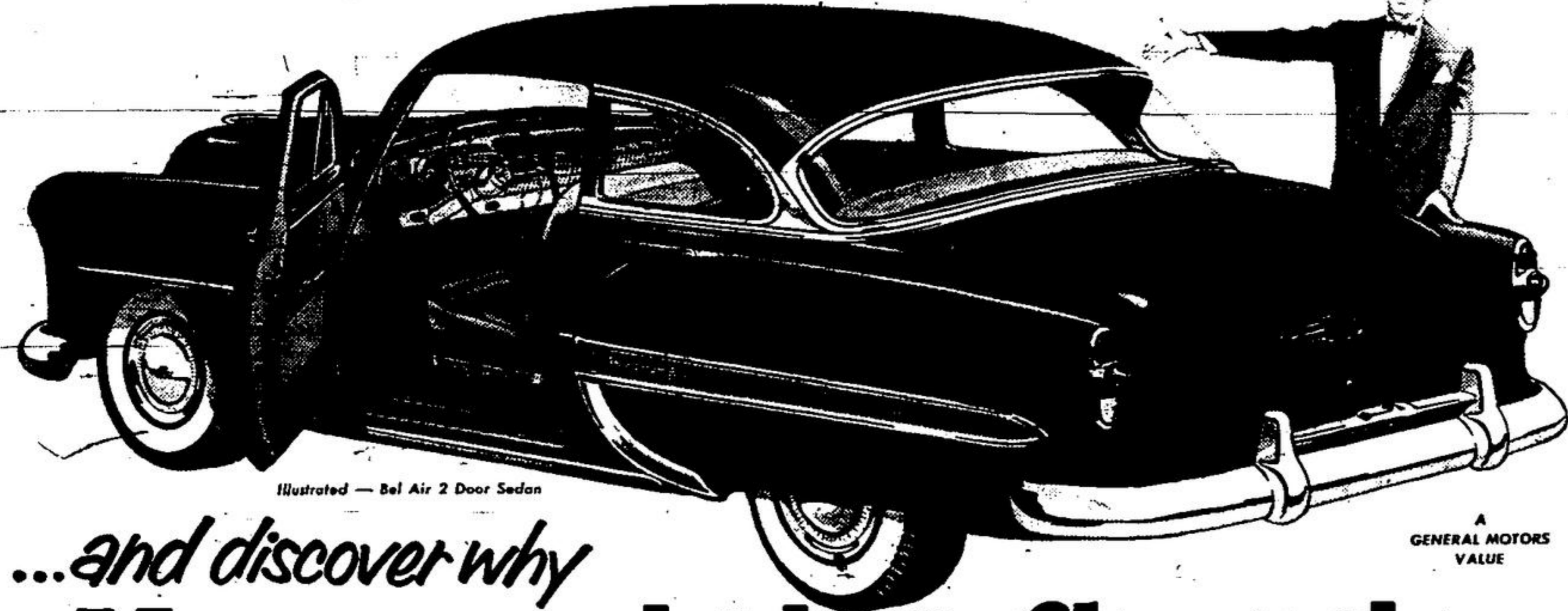

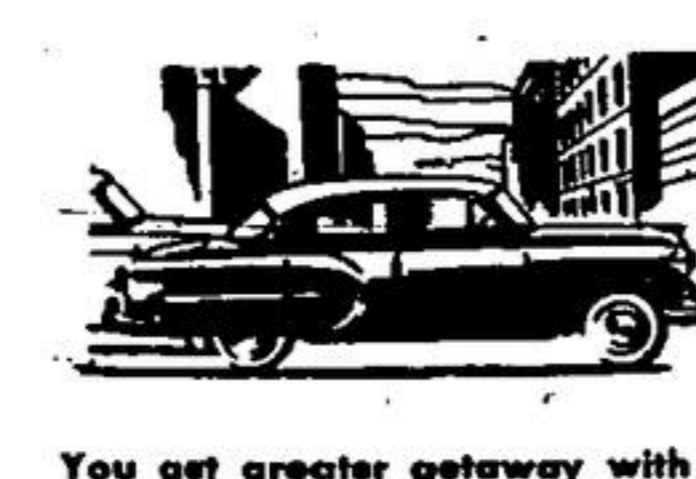
