A panel discussion took place afterwards members of this including William Snowden, Nanticoke, A. G. Skinner, George Ramsey, president of the county laymen's association, and Rev. Leonard Hatfield of the Council of Social Service. Mr. Hatfield will speak at the morning service next Sunday in St. Paul's Church, Norval.

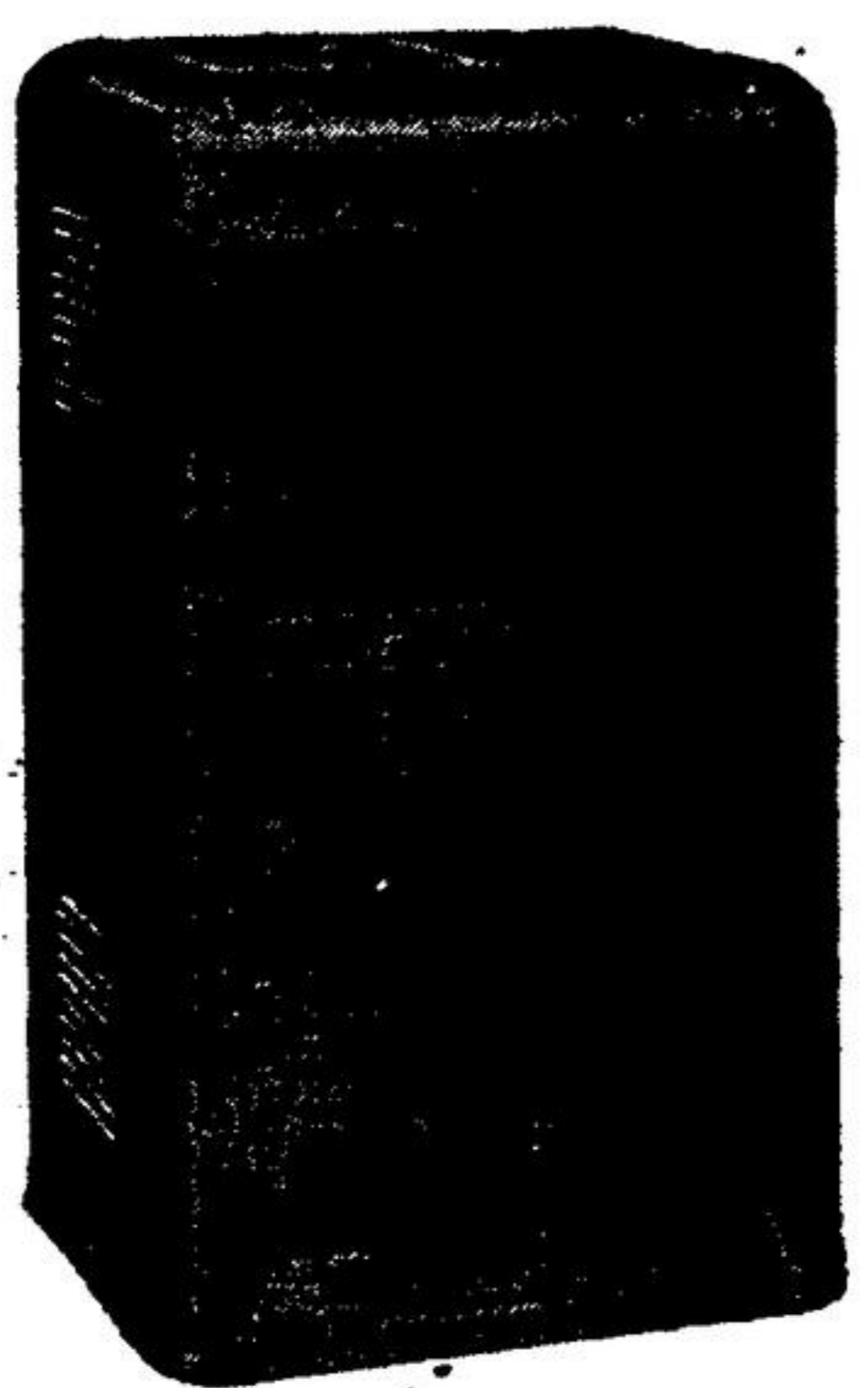
