

### Mrs. Arthur Leggett Once Norval Resident

A Presbyterian minister's wife, who lived at Norval while her husband was minister at churches at Norval and Union died on November 1st in hospital at Fergus.

Mrs. Arthur Leggett, 53, who was the former Ethel Rowe was born at Tweed, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Rowe, now of Peterborough. She was married at Coleville, Sask. in 1929. She taught school in Peterborough before going west as a seamstress and was supervisor of a girls' camp for the

Synod of Hamilton and London at Kintail for three years. She was a graduate of Toronto Bible College.

Leaving Norval in 1942 after a four year pastorate, Mr. and Mrs. Leggett went to Beauharnois, Quebec, and later to Vancouver where both were on the teaching staff of the Bible College there.

In 1951, he became minister of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Arthur. Mrs. Leggett was active in church work there until ill health forced her to give up these activities but from her bed she gave countless messages of help to every organization in the church.

She is survived by her husband and parents two sisters, Mrs. Sydney Leggett, Windsor, and Mrs. Donald Gillespie, Peterborough. Another sister, Mrs. Lily Ash, Peterborough, died suddenly of polio a year ago.

The funeral service was held in the church last Wednesday morning, with Reverend Professor Allan Ferris of Knox College conducting the service. Interment was in Little Lake Cemetery, Peterborough.
