

**CHILD EVANGELIST COMING TO KITCHENER**



One of the most unique meetings in the history of the Kitchener area will be held in the Memorial Auditorium Sunday at 3 p.m. when Mayor Bruce Weber, Kitchener, will introduce Renee Martz, world travelled 13 year old Crusader from Orlando, Florida, to an audience of thousands after which she will speak of the answer to national youth problems and their delinquency. Her material will be in youth's defence.

Renee said here today "The Royal Canadian Mounted Police made their report showing a substantial increase in crime in this country. Their annual report tells of a rising rate in the narcotic field with pedlars, safecracking and in particular the number of intoxications with motorists. There was a 14 percent increase in the crime rate over last year."

Miss Martz continued: "Shall this vice continue until your nation and mine suffer complete deterioration of humanity? Someone has to become a leader, a crusader in this nation destroying trend. I have taken that responsibility and am carrying the torch of spiritual light for a darkened world. I need the help of every mother and father. I want the prayers of every minister and church member and the support of all civic leaders. Please don't fail me in this hour."

A strong newspaper advertising campaign using weekly and daily papers is in progress for the meeting. Billboard posters, window cards attractively drawn to reach youth, and thousands of tabloids are being used for display purposes. A full usher crew will be on hand as the doors open at 1.30 p.m. All seats are free to the public.

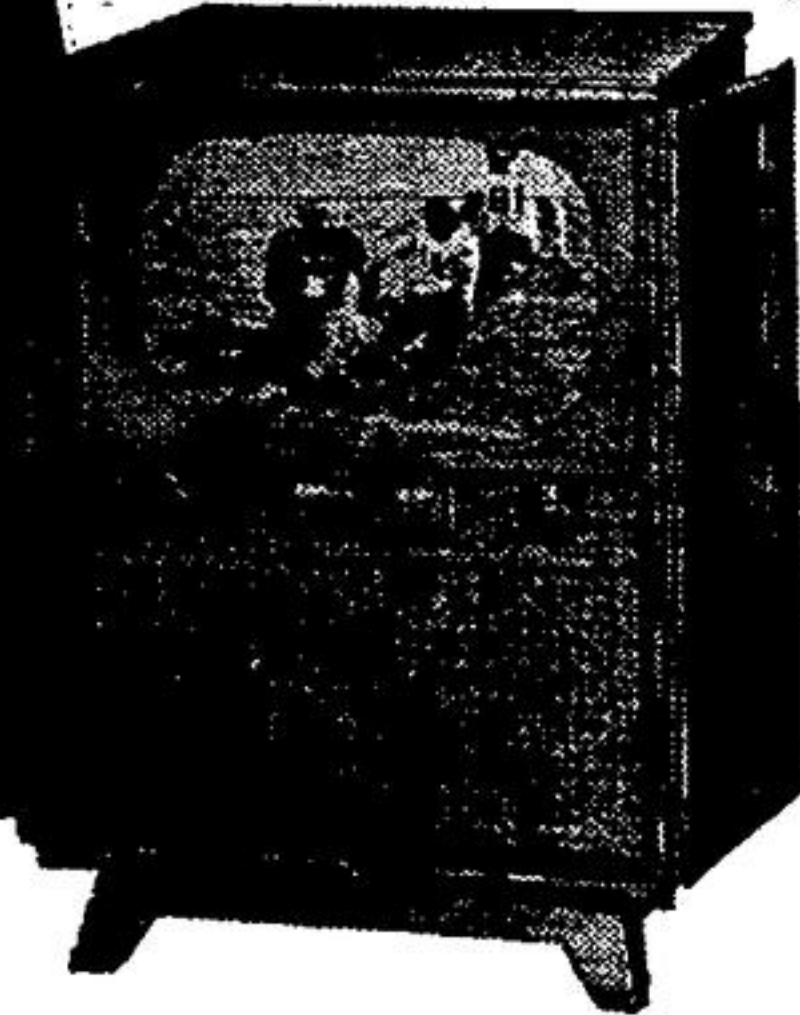
