SUGGEST REMEDY FOR URBAN-RURAL TENSIONS

Halton farm radio forum members gathered in Nelson Township Hall on Monday to listen to the broadcast "Urban-Rural Tensions" and were then divided into six discussion groups. Mr. S. Turner acted as discussion leader and gave the groups twenty minutes to report

their findings. Are people in your nearby towns unsympathetic to farmers and farm problems? was one question asked. Forum members replied that to some extent this is true, particularly city folk, though in Halton where urban centres are smaller, town people are more aware of

famers' production costs. Urban people are prone to omplain of high prices of farm produce, poor packaging and lack of quality, and it is common to hear it said that farmers do not pay in-

In answer to this, farmers reply that high prices are caused by the middleman. As for income tax, the farmer is left to his own honesty and conscience, and there are bound to be some who will cheat. To reduce misunderstanding, for-

um members suggested that farmers could write letters to newspapers, explaining the marketing situation and adopt public relations programmes which could include joint meetings to discuss mutual problems. They should insist on better marketing and suggested that there are too many middlemen. A majority opinion favoured cooperativ marketing schemes of various
