HIGH SCHOOL BOARD UPS SECRETARY SALARY

Meeting in Georgetown last week, North Halton High School district board upped the salary of secretary-treasurer Gordon O. Brown \$500. Colonel Brown will now receive \$1700 a year plus a car allowance of \$300.

Another motion passed by the board makes it unnecessary for principals of the three high schools to attend board meetings except to present their budget or unless notified by the secretary.

The meeting was called to discuss desks and other furnishings for the new Acton School and new additions at Georgetown and Milton. Mr. Stillman, who represents a number of manufacturing firms, had samples of desks and suggestions for furnishings in non-teaching areas.

Orders were placed for 185 desks, 25 commercial desks, 30 commercial chairs, 6 teachers' desks and chair and one commercial teacher's desk and chair. The building committee and secretary were empowered to visit showrooms and make selections of furnishings for the principals' offices and teachers' rooms.

START WORK ON I.G.A. STORE

Georgetown will have a new grocery store within the next two months.

Fletcher Construction, local contracting firm, started work this week on a new building on No. 7 Highway which he is building for a Burlington man, Bruce Williamson. It is located east of a block of stores recently constructed by Mr. Fletcher which are being offered for sale at the present time.

The new store will have 50 foot frontage on the highway and a depth of 85 feet. It will be of cement block and stucco construction with a modern store front. It marks the first entry of the Independent Grocers Association in Georgetown — a central buying organization of independent retailers.
