## First Awards Night Halton 4H Clubs

Rev. W. A. Young, of the Ontario Agricultural College, spoke to a large audience in the Milton High School on Friday evening. It was the occasion of the first annual Awards Night for Halton's 4H club members. The club members, parents, club leaders and other key folk from all parts of the county, crowded the auditorium to capacity. It was a delightful occasion and everyone was very pleased with the programme which was presided over by Art Bennett, Associate Agricultural Representative who was assisted by A. T. Woodley, George Pelletier, Fred Bell, Ken Ella, T. C. Amos, and other local club leaders.

Padre Young who was introduced by J. E. Whitlock, based his inspiring address on the 4H Club Emblem. "While we are in a recession, in my opinion," stated Padre Young, "the future is bright for Agriculture." "One thing you are going to need is a lot of faith, — do not be afraid of life — be prepared to take a chance — what we need in these days of social security is a little more of the spirit which our pioneer ancestors had — refuse to admit anything is impossible. Don't forget there is no substitute for hard work."

The able manner in which the speaker built his address around the 4H emblem — first H for head; 2nd H for Heart; 3rd H for Hand; and 4th H for Health; made it an address which will long be remembered by club members and by parents alike. Barry Archer extended to Padre Young the appreciation of the gathering.

The programme opened with a sing-song led by Dave Pelletier, assisted by Mrs. V. E. McArthur as accompanist.

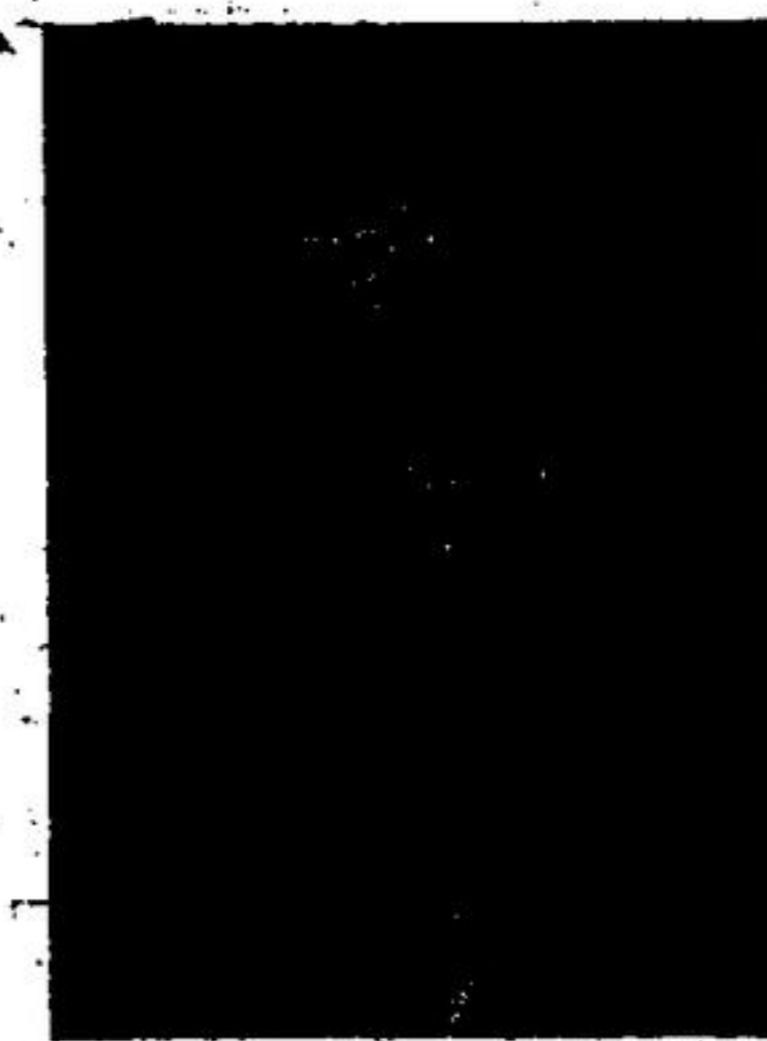
A few of the highlights of the long list of presentations of awards included the following:

(a) Inter-Club Showmanship Awards by Roy Currie, president of the Halton Agricultural Society; (b) —4H Pins and Crests, by George Pelletier, vice chairman of Halton's Club Leaders' Council; (c) Chestnut Jersey Farm Trophy; presented on behalf of Harry McKendrick, by Ken Ella, president of the Halton Jersey Club, to Mary Lou Alexander; (d) Walter Duffray Trophy; awarded to the club member in the Guernsey Section with the high aggregate score, won by George Greenlees, and presented by the donor, Walter Duffrey; (e) — Ontario Jersey Club Specials, by Herb Armstrong, secretary of the Ontario Jersey Club; (f) Walter Duffrey Trophy for Holsteins — won by Gordon Brain with the high aggregate score in the Holstein Club and presented by Walter Duffrey; (g) — W. W. Thompson Special of a True Type Model Holstein Cow, presented by president W. W. Thompson of the Halton Holstein Club to Gordon Brain; (h) — Ross Stores Special won by George Greenlees.

Other awards including the Ontario Shorthorn Specials; Ontario Guernsey Specials; Ontario Hereford Specials and Ontario Aberdeen Angus Specials were included with the regular awards.

Another pleasing feature of the presentation was the introduction of five members of Halton's 4H Beef and Dual Purpose Club who exhibited their animals at the Royal Winter Fair and brought back the following awards:

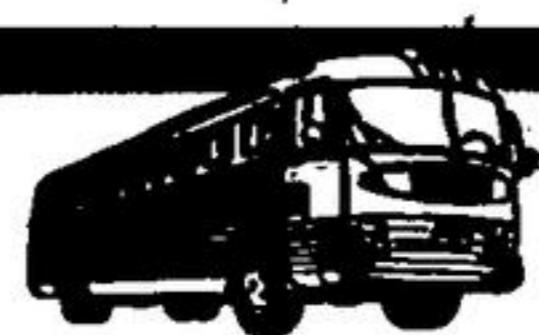

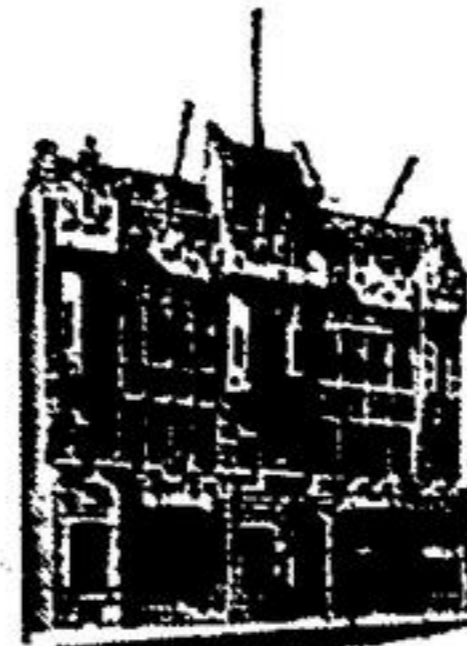
