Brantford Trucker R.R. Crossing Victim

A paper-backed novel "Sally Lies in Her Coffin" lay ironically beside the twisted body of 19-year-old Roy Eisenback, Brantford truck driver who was fatally injured last Wednesday noon when his five ton gravel truck plowed into passing CPR freight train on No. 7 Highway on the outskirts of Brampton.

OPP Constable Ken Darch of the Port Credit detachment said accident occurred when Eisenback failed to stop at the level crossing and crashed into the side of the engine.

So great was the force of impact that the side of one of the freight cars was ripped off as the truck plowed into it, before being tossed in pieces to the ground.

Wreckage lay scattered for a considerable distance around the fatally injured driver. One wheel was hurled about 80 feet away

from the scene. Engineer C. H. Osborne, of Owen Sound, said he saw the truck travelling east and when he realized it wasn't going to be able to stop he "pulled on the emergency brake mighty quick." He told police the warning bell was ringing. "I can't understand why he didn't stop," he

"It was terrible," he murmured. "There was the poor lad lying all twisted in the ditch and I could do nothing for him. My fireman, E. Wilson, Toronto, ran to telephone the police and a doctor."

Roy Eisenback was driving a truck belonging to his brother Richard. They operate the Blue Bird Truck Line out of Brantford and he had delivered a load of gravel shortly before the accident which took his life.
