Howard L. Craise, director of the Ontario Federation of Agriculture, was guest speaker and addressed the meeting on "the federation of agriculture and its policy in the marketing of farm produce."

Following the address, J. E. Whitlock chaired a panel discussion on the question of a policy for Canadian agriculture, with Prof. Ralph Campbell, agricultural economist, O.A.C. H. L. Craise, W. E. Breckon, A. H. Service and R. S. Heatherington as panel members.

In the morning a directors meeting was held. The hall was filled in the afternoon for the annual meeting of the federation.

The meeting passed a resolution that the Halton County Federation of Agriculture send a vote of thanks to Ontario Federation to be forwarded to the Canadian Feder-

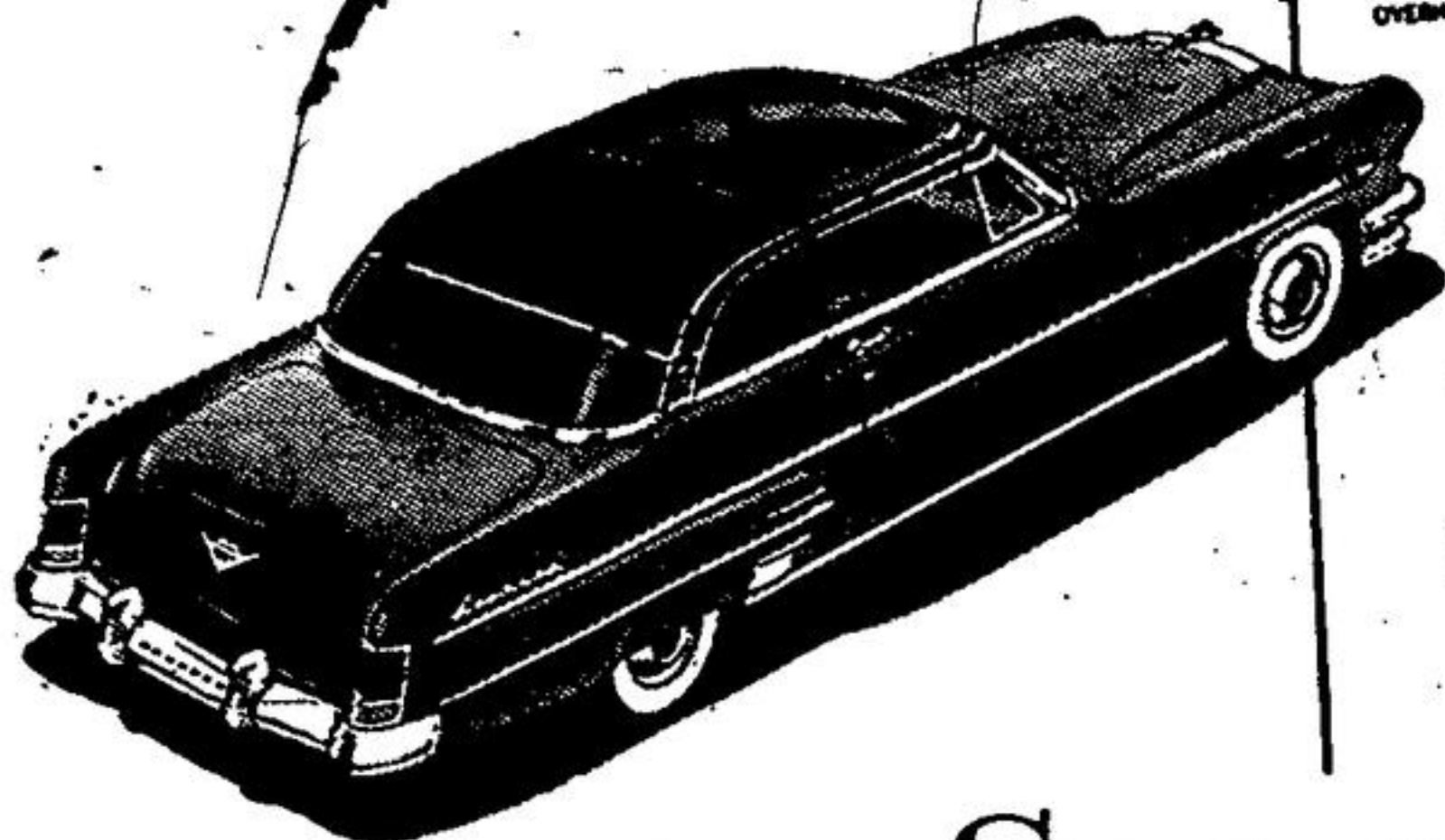

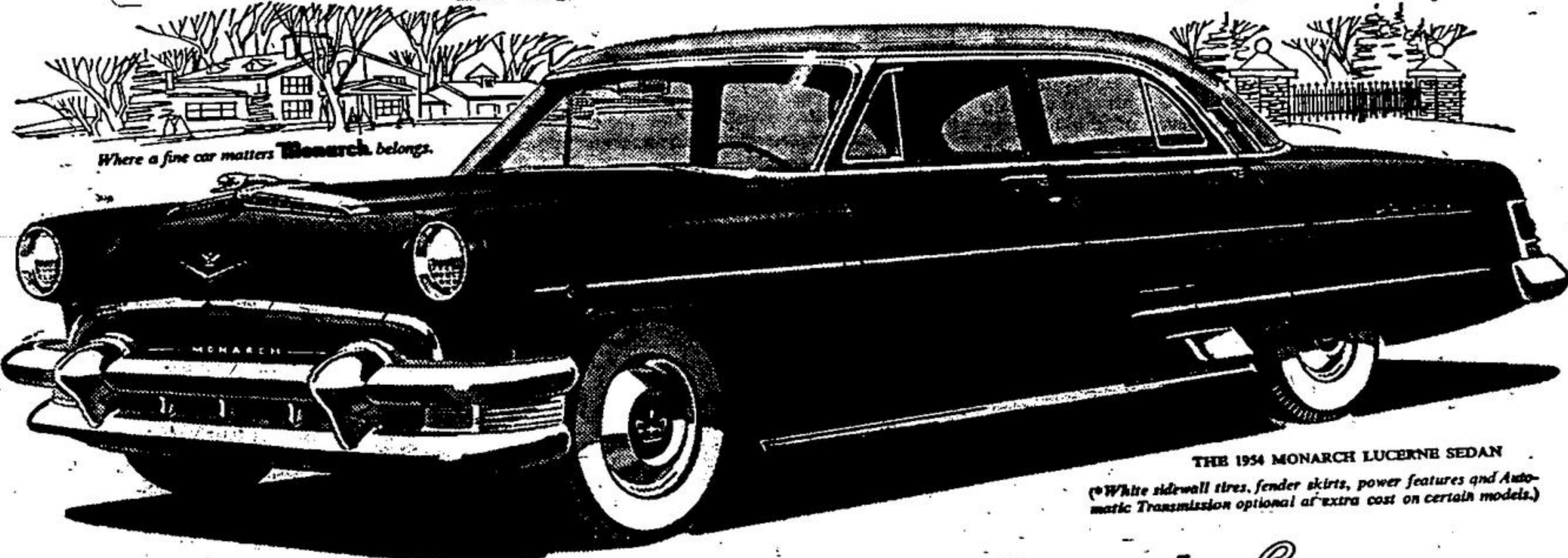
