Lawyer's Father Was Prominent City Doctor

An industrial physician for many Toronto firms, Dr. James Albert Roy Glancy, 62, died suddenly last Tuesday at his home, Church St., Toronto. He was the father of Kenneth Glancy, partner in the local law firm of Hewson and Glancy.

Dr. Glancy, who graduated in medicine from the University of Toronto in 1917, had practiced in Toronto for the past 28 years. Previously he had spent three years in the Yukon with the Guggenheim Mining Co.

Dr. Glancy had a large industrial practice and had been looking after accidents occurring during the building of the Toronto subway.

He was a Mason and belonged to the Oddfellows Lodge and the Foresters. He was a member of St. Paul's Anglican Church and belonged to the Granite Club. Son of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Glancy, he was born in Newmarket.

Dr. Glancy is survived by his wife, Violet whom he married at Lake Joseph, Muskoka, in 1925, and their only son, Kenneth. Dr. Cecil Swanson, rector of St. Paul's, conducted the funeral service last Thursday at the Fred Matthews Chapel and interment was in Mount Pleasant Cemetery.

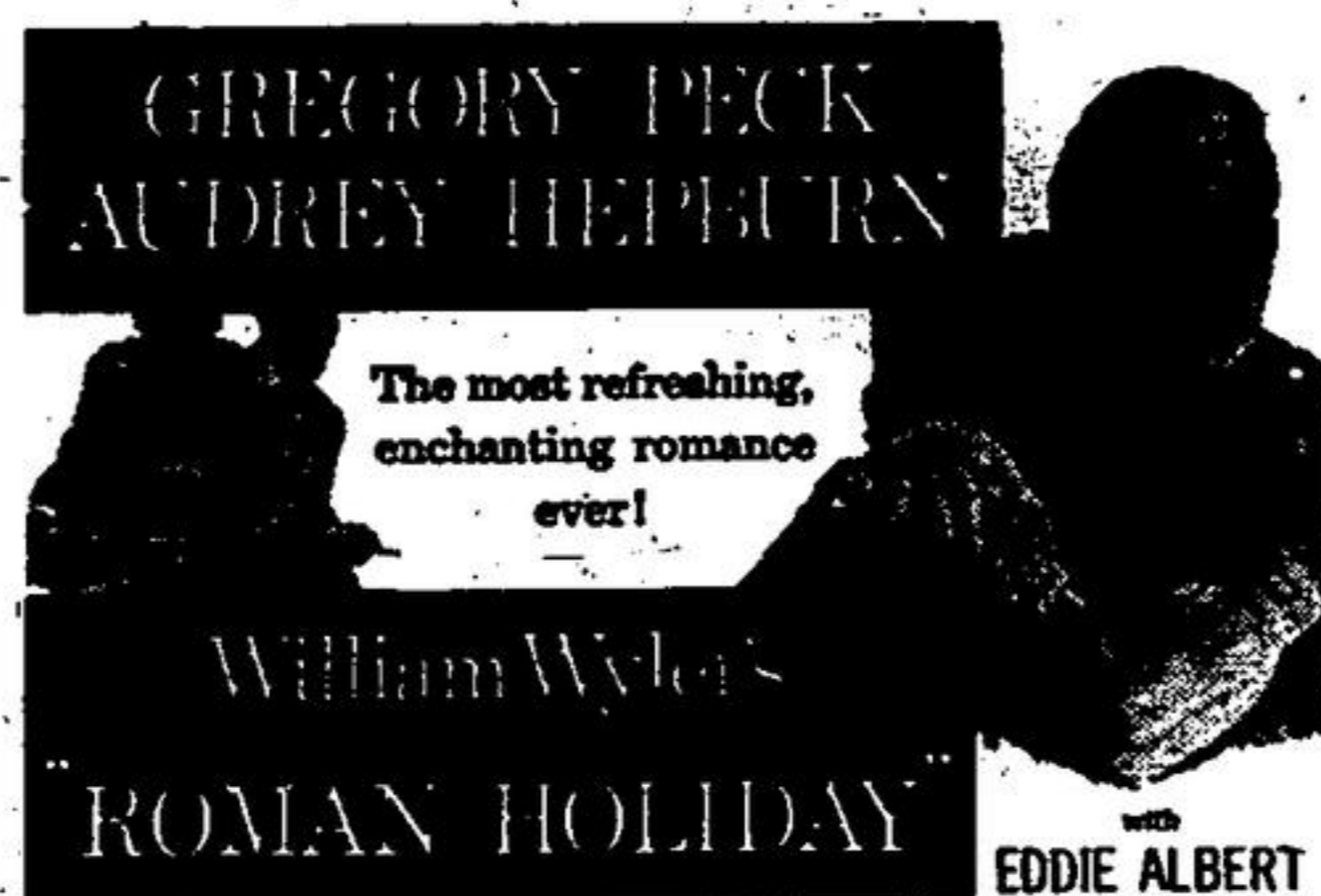
