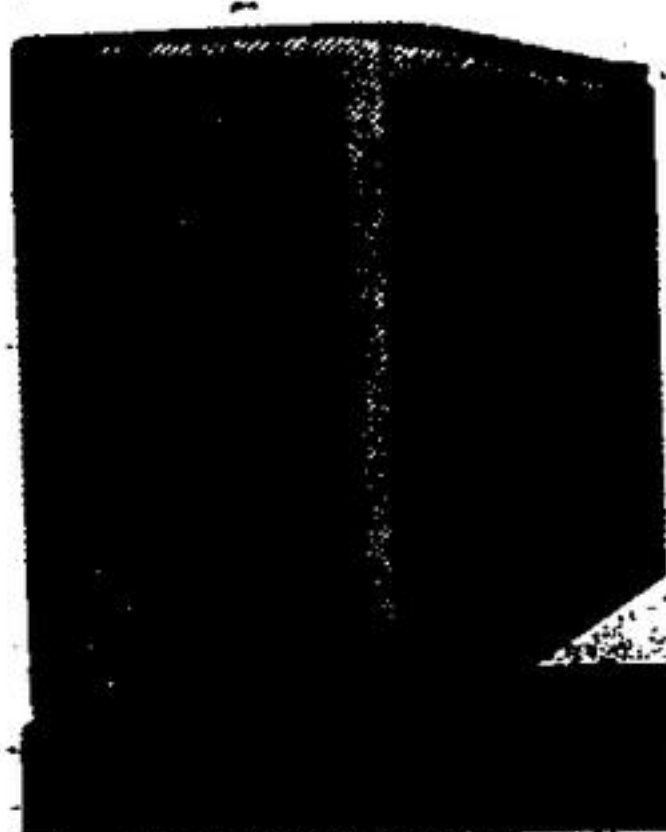

Christmas Theme In Baptist Church

Special Christmas messages were given through the ministry of word and song at the services held in the Baptist Church on Sunday. At the beginning of the morning worship the children of the Sunday School presented their white gifts. The choir anthems for this service were "When the Lord of Love was Born," "The First Christmas Morn" and "In The Bleak Mid-Winter."

The Rev. Alfred J. Barker brought a vivid and realistic picture of the needs of the modern world in his sermon "A Perfect Christmas." Mr. Barker chose his sermon text Matthew 2:10-11. "When they saw the star they rejoiced with exceeding great joy, and when they were come into the house they saw the young child with Mary his mother, and fell down and worshipped him, and when they had opened their treasures they presented unto him gifts; gold and frankincense and myrrh." Here we see all the elements of a perfect Christmas. (1) Joy: When the Wise Men beheld the star they were filled with joy because it stood for a symbol of the birth of the Messiah, the Saviour of the World; the Hope

of the World. (2) Worship: This is the silence of beholding, we should at all times kneel in worship and adoration until something of his beauty and holiness comes into our hearts. (3) Service: We give our service through our time, talents and gifts. The Wise Men gave costly gifts because they were radiantly happy, and God calls us to open the caskets of our lives through our gifts to be given after we have first worshipped Him. (4) Obedience: The modern world shrinks from this word. Each time we worship God we should be different and there is no real joy without obedience in our lives. We must obey the voice of God if we desire a Perfect Christmas.

The singing of familiar carols opened the evening. The film "Emmanuel" was shown with Mr. W. Townsend acting as narrator. During this presentation the choir under the direction of Mrs. W. Townsend provided the following selections: "Come, O Come Emmanuel," choir; "Of the Father's Love Begotten," A. J. Barker; "Behold a Virgin" Mrs. D. Hancock; "Magnificat" Mrs. N. Trafford; "O Little Town of Bethlehem," choir; "No Room in the Inn," D. Cole; "The Poor be the Chamber," D. Peck; "Awake Were They Only," choir; "Poverty," choir; "What Child is This," Mesdames N. Trafford, R. Buttrey; "Unto Us a Son is Born," choir; "Arise Shine," choir.

The soft glow of candles, the nativity scene, Christmas decorations and memorial baskets of flowers adorned the sanctuary.
