**Farmed Out West  
For Forty Years**

A Saskatchewan farmer for forty years, David McMenemy, 71, was buried in Glen Williams Cemetery on Thursday.

Mr. McMenemy died in Fergus, where he had lived for the past five years. He was a Glen Williams native and was a son of the late James McMenemy and Mary Ann Sloan. He went west as a young man and was a farmer at Purdue, Saskatchewan. He retired eight years ago and returned to Ontario, living for a time in Georgetown with a nephew, Bert McMenemy. A foot infection, after months of having his feet frozen while out west, recurred, and Mr. McMenemy spent a year in Guelph General Hospital before he moved to Fergus.

Unmarried, his closest relative is a brother Joe McMenemy in Glen Williams. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge in Saskatoon.

Mr. Norman Russ, minister of Ballinacred United Church, conducted the funeral service at the McClure Funeral Home. Pallbearers were Bert McMenemy, James Kirkwood, Fred Sinclair, Jack McMenemy, Thomas Hill and Gear Sinclair, Milton.
