### Band Promoter Founder Waterloo Music Festival

Charles F. Thiele, 70, · leading band promoter and founder of the Waterioo Music Festival, died last Wednesday at the Kitchener Waterico Hospital. Mr. Thiele was director of the Waterloo Music Soclety Band for more than 30 years.


