HOG SURVEY SHOWS INTERESTING FIGURES

The third quarterly survey has just been completed by Halton Hog Producers, states A. R Service, secretary of the association. In the survey the same twenty producers are contacted each quarter. In contrast to the survey made in early October, when the twenty producers had 81 sows, the survey just completed this month shows the numher of sows at 57. In pigs 2 months and under, the recent survey reveuls 329 wearling pigs in contrastto 271 of the same age four months ago In the age group 2 to 4 months the February survey reveals 242 in contrast to 314, four months ago. Finally in the age group 4 months and over, there were 252 pigs in the Pebruary survey against 231 on the same farms last September.
