Gold Ribbon Certificate for Bingham Holstein

Fletcher Thomas, Ontario Minister of Agriculture at last year's annual Holstein-Friesian meeting, Kyle Bingham, representing Harold Bingham and Son, Georgetown, was one of five farmers in Ontario who received Gold Ribbon certificates of Longtime Production at the 1954 annual last week. Katherine Mercedes Dutchland, whose milk production in 1953 ranked her over the 200,000 lb. mark was responsible for the presentation.

Gold Ribbon certificates of Longtime Production covering five records exceeding 200,000 lbs. milk completed in 1953 were presented at the annual meeting of the Holstein-Friesian Association of Canada, held February 10th in Toronto. It is significant of the advances being made in lifetime records that five were completed last year, while only five had previously been made over all the years testing has been carried on in Canada.

Kyle Bingham of Harold Bingham and Son, Georgetown, was one of those honoured, his gold ribbon being for Katherine Mercedes Dutchland who in 13 lactations has produced 203,502 lbs. milk, 7,515 lbs. fat, 3.69 per cent butterfat.

Last year, the Bingham received a Master Breeder Shield, highest honour a Holstein breeder can win, and this year a Brampton farmer, D. S. Dunton, was one of nine so honoured.

Another Haltonite, Ross Segaworth, Burlington, was re-elected as an association director.

N. R. Martin, St. Thomas, succeeds J. W. Hosford, South Edmonton, Alberta as president.

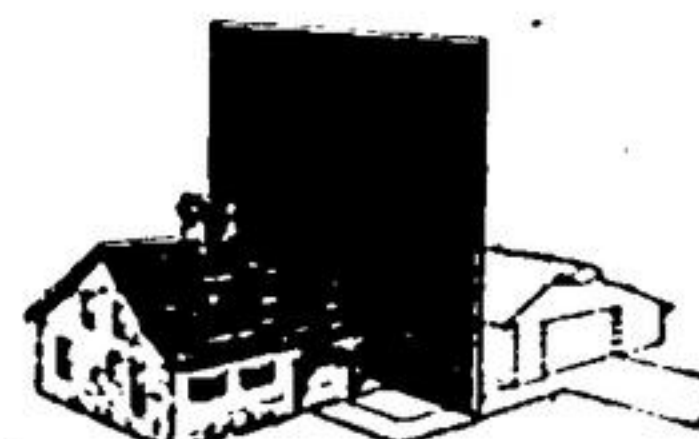

It offers the first opportunity I know of for a breeder to have his cake and eat it. He can stock, he 5,000 ampoules of semen from a bull, then sell the bull but through his supply of frozen semen he still has the bull." Secretary G. McClelland, Brantford, reported that the association had the best year in its history in 1953. Membership stood at the all time high of 12,719, a total of 67,650 entries were registered, the largest number yet and 51,152 transfers of ownership were recorded. Some 17,928 head were exported as against 2,235 in 1952, the year of the foot and mouth ban, and 14633 in 1951.
