Jersey Breeders Visit Three District Hards

Halton Jersey Breeders, under the joint leadership of presidents Mac Alexander and agricultural representative J. E. Whitelock, visited three of the top Jersey herds in Central Ontario on Wednesday of last week, those of B. H. Bull and Son; Featherstone Bros., and Maurice C. Bonty.

At the Bull estate the party was welcomed by Colonel Bartley and John Bull and conducted by them on a tour of three of their barns. On this 1000 acre estate, there are some 750 Jerseys at the present time.

The two Halton herds visited, · while much smaller in . numbers, impressed the members of the party with the general high average qualsty. Jack and Bill Featherstone are. carrying some 63 or 64 head on . their 100 acre farm. Of the 12 milking females classified under selective registration, they have two excellent cows; 21 Very goods and 6 Good Plus; with an average score of 88.8. We also learned that to date they have 12 daughlers classified from their former hord sire Brampton Jersey Basil. Their average score is 87 and a fraction. The tinal call was at the 200 acre Lindale Farm, where M. C. Beaty has some 85 head. The other point of interest was a tour of the 321/2 acre Ford assembly plant at Oakville. Here the members of the party followed the assembly line which is turning out 850 cars daily.
