## Plays, Choir, Cadets In Commencement Show

Four plays, selections by the choir and a cadet precision squad provided entertainment at the high school commencement exercises on Thursday and Friday in Wrigglesworth School auditorium.

Academic awards were presented on Friday and athletic on Thursday. That evening school board member Ernest Forgrave was chairman and he spoke of how closely an athletic program is linked to a high school education and the importance of a gymnasium which he hopes to see added to the Georgetown school in the future.
