April Hydro Inventory For Georgetown 60 Cycle

The first week in April Ontario Hydro crews will move into Georgetown to begin the door to door job of inventorying all frequency-sensitive electrical equipment owned by domestic and commercial customers, in preparation for 25 to 60 cycle changeover.

Announcing this today, hydro chairman Robert H. Saunders said that this "Operation Inventory" generally precedes actual changeover in customers' homes from five to six months. He said that inventory crews would have completed this pre-standardization task by about the end of April.

Mr. Saunders said that actual changeover of home appliances and other equipment for 60 cycle operation is scheduled to get under way in Georgetown early in October, and will require approximately three weeks to complete.

He explained that inventory has to be carried out well in advance of changeover to provide sufficient time for the ordering and allocation of materials, and for the planning of specific engineering for the 60-cycle change over of each customer's equipment.

"Because the Hydro makes all preparations for changeover from inventory lists," the hydro chairman pointed out, "it is most im-

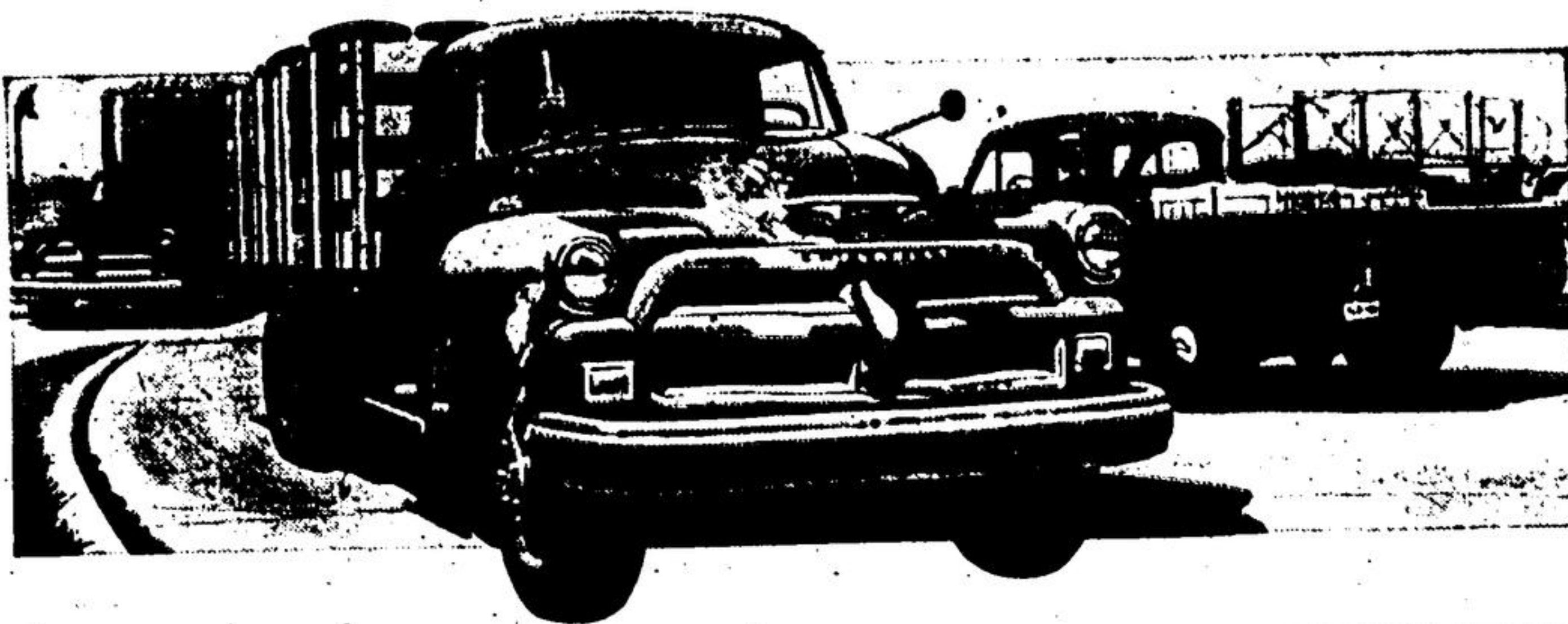
