Do you need a new bathroom floor?

The cost for the material is moderate. For a room size 9'x6' you would require plywood underlayment at a cost of \$3.60, ringed nails and one hundred 9" x 9" tiles. Linoleum tiles in No. 3 gauge would be 12c each, in standard gauge 15c and A grade 20c. In Vinyl on felt back 33c each or Vinyl on rubber back 33c each or Vinyl asbestos 20c each. Rubber tile would be 25c each for lightweight and 35c for heavy weight. For your own labour and from \$20.00 up you could have a new attractive, and easily kept floor.
