Esquesing Will Restrict Use of Cabin Trailers

Regulations for use of cabin trailers as dwellings, ere-contained in legislation passed by Esquesing Council at their April meeting. The by-law has been forwarded to the Municipal Board which must give approval before it becomes law.

Strict regulations govern use of trailers for any purpose other than temporary accommodation while a house is being built. If a person is building a home, he is granted the right to use a trailer for a period up to's year, with no fee Being charged.

for transient dwellers, trailers cannot be used on any property without first securing a township licetion but a cost of \$25 which is valid for 60 days. At the township's discretion this licence can be senewed for a further 60 days, on payment of another \$25 fee. It is

only renowable once. The by-law also provides gestrictions against parking trailers on public road allowance for a longer period than 48 hours.

Penalties up to \$50 are provided for infractions of the by-laws.
